

## That Three Fat Quarter Quilt plus borders

Approximately 42" square

This quilt would be great for that new baby, on the pram, in the car or just because!

Quick and easy to make and with such scrumptious fabrics available

- how delicious!

## Requirements:

Centre 3 Fat Quarters (Approx. 18" x 21" each) - cut each into 12 x 5" squares (36 sqs)

Border 1 & Binding 5/8 yard (50cm) - cut into 2 x 1½" x 27½" (narrow side borders)

2 x 1½" x 29½" (narrow top & bottom borders)

4 x 2½" strips across fabric width (binding)

Main Border 5/8 yard (50cm) - cut into 2 x 4½" x 29½" (side borders)

 $2 \times 4\%$ "  $\times 38\%$ " (top & bottom borders)

Backing Approx. 42' square
Batting Approx. 42' square

## Method:

All seams allowances are ¼", press seams as you go.

Cut the Fat Quarters into squares as listed above.

Join the squares together into rows, alternating the fabrics. Join the rows together.

Attach the narrow borders, sides first, then top and bottom.

Layer your quilt with batting and backing and baste together. To do this, I use masking tape to hold the backing out smoothly, right side down, then gently lay the batting on top then the quilt top, right side up. Then I use safety pins to hold it all togather, quite a few, approximately 4" apart all over the quilt.

Quilt the quilt! I have used an all over quilting free-motion design, or you could do straight lines, maybe going diagonally across the quilt. You may have an even better idea for quilting!

Join together the binding strips to make one long strip. Fold in half lengthways and bind your quilt.
