



Home Eye Test

Instructions:

- Print out this piece of paper
- Hold the paper ~40 cm (~16 inches) from your eyes in well-lit conditions
- Cover one eye
- Read the sample text below, and stop when you can no longer read a complete line; this is the limit of your visual acuity
- Find the associated diopter in the right column; this is the approximate correction needed to provide normal visual acuity (20/20 or 6/6 vision) – and the power of monocle that is best for you
