Three places not to miss when you go:

- \* The Niche, a household and clothing store opened in November. It's owned by the same people who run The Niche in Shoppers Square Mall in Reno. The store has great affordable clothing and cute home decor items. I picked up this pair of his-and-her metal hooks. I thought the hooks paired with towels would make the perfect wedding gift.
- \* The Cooking Gallery is two stories of cute kitchen gadgets. It's full of stuff you don't need, but want. I picked up this Basil Blue Sage kitchen Countertop Cleaner that is fabulous.
- \* Moody's Bistro & Lounge has a great selection of small plates and appetizers. I'd highly recommend the Tomato Soup en Croute and the Ahi four ways.

Directions to downtown Truckee: From Reno take Interstate 80 to the first Truckee exit. Turn right from the exit and then left onto Donner Pass Road toward downtown Truckee. After the stop sign continue straight. Parking on the main drag is done through new high tech meters. You pay at one of several ATM-like machines and display your paid ticket in your car window.
