Updated Game Charts for ODIs

The following charts are my attempt to produce realistic results for a ODI match using the MPCC system. They are simply designed to replace the corresponding charts that are used for Test Matches, while preserving all the other rules of the game.

This means that players are not required to always be in attacking or free-swinging mode while playing ODIs. They may play in the regular and defensive batting styles if they so desire. Updated Batting and Bowling Charts also help to generate individual results that correspond with the ratings of each batsman or bowler. The Flurry Chart remains unchanged.

The only rule change is that *Close Fielding settings may be employed against all Attacking or Free Swinging batsmen regardless of their rating.* Close Fielding tactics must always be used during a Power Play.

The numbers in brackets in the Basic Results Chart indicate the result of the over *when Far Fielding settings are in place.* This is to mimic the fact that the strike is rotated much more frequently when the field is spread. If far fielding settings are not in place, then all the runs go to the striker.

So, for example, if a 10 is drawn while the batsman is attacking, the striker scores all six runs himself *unless Far fielding settings are employed.* In this case, each batsmen scores 3 runs each from the over.

On the batting and bowling rating charts, all runs go to the current striker, regardless of the current field settings.

Players should find that these tables generate believable results, not just for the overall totals, but also for individual batting and bowling figures.
