H.A.L.O. is sprinkled with humor and inspiration. Tell the Bethlehem story featuring a heavenly radio station. In the mix is "Breaking News", Commercials, Interviews, Talk Shows, Game Shows and lots of music!

PROGRAM DIRECTOR

... Getting the Radio Show On The Air



Direct a humorous, inspirational celebration of the Bethlehem story. Organize teams who take charge of their segment.

Make program copies and assign segments to Sunday School classes, church committees, small groups of friends and willing individuals who agree to become part of H.A.L.O.

Follow directions. Ask group leaders to organize their group complete with props and costumes. Be prepared to help but for the most part the leaders should handle their material. The result will be an old fashioned Radio Show telling the story of Jesus' birth in a unique way.

Prepare your heart. For some church members, holiday programs presented by your church comprise most, if not all, of their Christmas celebration. Do it for the Lord! Do it for those folks!

One Step At A Time. It is possible that you are thinking, "Why me? I cannot do this!" Put those feelings aside and dive into this appealing presentation of Christmas as experienced by an old time heavenly radio station offering a new take of "On The Air".

Delegate. Sunday School teachers and group leaders become involved by preparing their people for the program. Trust the staff to carry out their tasks.



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Practice A Positive Approach. It is worth extra effort in the midst of personal preparations, party going and travel to make Christmas sparkle.

Statements like, "We can't do it", "We never did it this way", or "No one wants to do it", are inappropriate. If the Director's attitude is right, even the grouchiest saint responds cheerfully!

Pray! Take details before the Lord and then-RELAX! God is in control. Carry out the tasks at hand.

Plan! Make a program copy and mark areas requiring special attention. Adapt the material. Eliminate what cannot be used, divide parts and combine parts when necessary.

Give teachers and participants copies of their segment in a colorful folder.

Prepare! Hopefully you have ordered H.A.L.O. ... On The Air with more than one month lead time. Assign responsibility for small group practice to each teacher/leader.

Some churches enjoy memorization and others avoid it. Except for the youngest non readers, it is possible to read all parts. Memorization means lead time is longer and intensive rehearsal is essential.

This is an ALL CHURCH Production! Involve adults as readers, musicians and leaders. Adapt the program to use available number of participants.

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Adapting H.A.L.O.

Adapt the program to fit your church needs. H.A.L.O. lasts forty five minutes to one hour, depending upon special music. HARP AND HORN DINER Party is not included in time frame.



H.A.L.O.

SMALL CHURCH

Remove segments requiring more people than available. Combine speaking parts.

For a combined junior/senior high school class, eliminate one presentation and feature your favorite segment. OR, use the same students to present both segments.

Teens and adults are crucial to the small church presentation. Some people participate several times.

MEDIUM CHURCH

Adaptations take the form of personal preference. Choose segments you like best. The goal is to tell the Christmas story so don't leave out anything important!

LARGE CHURCH

Use as many people as possible. Organize snack makers, servers, prop masters, sound/lighting staff and others who make the program exciting.

HARP AND HORN DINER

Ask an adult Sunday School class, women's group or group of friends to complete party plans. They decorate, plan and prepare food and clean up.



CHRISTMAS MUSIC!



Coordinate music with music director, organist/pianist. Choose Christmas Carols. Include words in a printed program or on a screen.

H.A.L.O.

CAROLS

Sing traditional Christmas Carols. Practice during Sunday School Opening, for three weeks prior to performance. Choose contemporary Christmas choruses from music you own and enjoy.

Feature church talent. These musical options are NOT in the existing program. Choose music from your own collection. Consider time limitations during planning stages.

STAGE AND PROPS



H.A.L.O. ... On The Air! Is a unique presentation using a minimum of props and staging. Each group carries personal props on stage.

SET UP. Christmas trees, Nativity, twinkle lights, poinsettias and candles already in the sanctuary add to the festive atmosphere.

STAGING. Place two or three microphone stands across the stage. Attach cardboard replicas of old

fashioned radio microphones to the front of each stand. (See illustration.) Twist twinkle lights along each stand.

"Sky Bird", Famous Radio Personality, sits at a simple news desk with microphone throughout the program.

Make a large cardboard radio. Place in the center background. (See radio illustration.) Or, borrow old radios from shops or church members and display them on small tables.

SEATING. Reserve class seating. Assign assistants to sit with young children.

SOUND SYSTEM. Place microphones within easy reach. Speakers must be heard clearly. This detail makes the difference between a frustrating experience and a delightful program.

LIGHTING. Light Christmas trees, candles and other mood lighting. Place small spot lights on the floor shining up at each microphone.

COSTUMES

H.A.L.O. ... simple cost a large participant attire. Par may be will clothing. directions segment.

H.A.L.O. ...On The Air requires simple costuming. When costuming a large group, ask each participant to prepare their attire. Parents of young students may be willing to supply necessary clothing. Follow specific directions for each program segment.

PATTERN SUGGESTIONS

Pillow Cases: Cut a neck hole in the top of the pillowcase. Cut the front to the neck hole. Cut arm holes. This makes a long, vest. Plaid or striped flannel pillowcases work great for little shepherds and wise men.

Fabric: Two wide fabric strips(one over each shoulder) crossed across the back and front, tied with a sash makes a great costume.

Head Wraps: A fabric square over the head with a wide ribbon or piece of cloth around the head makes a headpiece. Large scrunchies (like girls wear around pony tails) hold the fabric tightly.

Bathrobes: Purchase bathrobes at garage sales/resale shops. Use contrasting fabric for headdresses and sashes to complete the costume.



Angels: Use white cotton or silver lame' fabric. Angels may wear wings or remain wingless. Place gold or silver tinsel garland taped in a circle on each angel head. Tie tinsel around the waist for a sparkling angel belt. Angels may wear face/hair glitter for that "extra sparkle"! Bare feet!

Student Ushers

Once everyone is costumed to perfection, recruit angel, shepherd and wise men ushers who distribute programs and seat people.

Place students at each door and coach them to say, "Welcome to HALO..ON THE AIR. May I show you to your seat?" Or, "Where would you like to sit?" It is an added personal touch that is much appreciated by many audience members.

Meet with ushers to explain how to greet guests, especially if students have never done this. Assign a team of two to a specific door.

After The Show

Ask participants to remain in costume for the HARP They AND HORN DINER celebration. mav serve beverages, greet quests and wander through the party area while people eat and talk.

PUBLICITY



Publicize H.A.L.O. ...On the Air through all church communication channels. Announce it in the church newsletter, the weekly worship bulletin and from the pulpit.

CHURCH BULLETIN AND NEWSLETTER Print an announcement in November and December newsletters. If you plan the HARP AND HORN DINER Party, let people know there will be a Christmas party, including food, following the program.

LOCAL NEWSPAPER

Include an announcement with church holiday programming publicity. Talk to a reporter to see if a feature article is possible. Include pictures!

TELEVISION AND RADIO

Advertise on your television cable channel. Radio stations often have free spots available as community service. It may be one more avenue of great publicity. Check it out!

CHRISTMAS CARD INVITATIONS

Christmas Card invitations are effective for families who send their children to Sunday School but are not involved. Use real Christmas cards with invitations tucked inside.

TEACHERS

Pray! Prepare! Present!

ADAPT H.A.L.O. TO FIT YOUR GROUP NEEDS

INVOLVE AS MANY STUDENTS AS POSSIBLE



More students than speaking parts? Divide existing parts. Less students than speaking parts? Combine existing parts. Assign specific people the tasks of holding visuals, carrying props and costuming.

HIGHLIGHT INDIVIDUAL PARTS

Will students memorize speaking parts or read them? If reading, print scripts on white copy paper much like scripts appeared in radio days.

PRACTICE WITH YOUR GROUP

Use the first minutes of Sunday School class to practice and discuss costuming and props. Assign specific tasks. Adapt the segment to fit your group.

COMMUNICATE WITH PARENTS

Let parents know when to have their children at rehearsals. Invite parents to attend the performance and be sure they know what props or costuming their child must bring. Collect props and store them in the classroom.



THE PROGRAM DIRECTOR VALUES YOUR LEADERSHIP!



SHOW UP WITH A SMILE!

H.A.L.O.

Meet your group. Dress in appropriate costumes, line up and enter the sanctuary as directed. Sit with your group in the designated area. Lead them on and off stage. Perform your speaking part with enthusiasm. Coach students quietly if they have problems.

Stage fright is not uncommon!

AFTER THE PROGRAM

Stay for the **HARP AND HORN DINER** Party. Collect props and materials before attending the party. Ask students to remain in costume. Mingle and enjoy the experience with your students and their families.

IF YOU NEED HELP

The Program Director is available. You will be responsible to have your group ready to participate. The program comes together with little formal large group rehearsal.

ENJOY THE EXPERIENCE

This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to touch the lives of children and adults. Take time to enjoy your small part of the bigger picture. The Bethlehem Story is classic and life changing. The spiritual experience is amazing!

COMMERCIALS!

Each segment features a commercial. There are several options to consider when presenting them.

TEACHER/LEADER

Ask the specific teacher/leader to present the commercial within their segment, speaking into a standing microphone.

SKY BIRD

The actor portraying Sky Bird, H.A.L.O.'s Radio host, can break into the action and read each commercial.

ONE PITCHMAN

Ask one person to read each commercial at the appropriate time. This actor remains on stage with Sky Bird. Choose someone with a great speaking voice and sense of humor.

Name the salesman who uses it as an introduction for each commercial break:

Here's Johnny Angel, Comin' Atcha' for HALO Radio!

VARIETY OF READERS

In the spirit of involving as many people as possible, assign specific commercials to a variety of readers.



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RADIO DAYS SOUND EFFECTS

Consider adding sound effects. If it's not possible, the program is still complete. Sound effects are not noted within the script. If choosing to use them, decide where to place specific effects for the best response.

Choose one or two people to handle sound. They make decisions on where to place the effects within the script. Sometimes "live" sound effects can be devised and are more fun than canned effects.

Create sounds for commercials and crowds. H.A.L.O. may have an audio trademark (like N-

B-C chimes). The first four notes of Handel's "Hallelujah Chorus" played on piano/organ/chimes/bells work well.

SOUND EFFECTS!

Have some fun with sound effects at a good price...free! There are other companies this specific online company offers 890 sounds. Check out RADIO SOUND:

Choose MP3 Downloads and .wav Downloads and Good Quality.wav sounds. Or, opt to purchase better quality sound effects the company offers for sale. They sell a CD for \$9.99 at the site.

"SKY BIRD" HOST WITH THE MOST HEAVENS FAMOUS RADIO PERSONALITY

Become H.A.L.O. Radio's Master of Ceremonies. As the Heavenly Radio Station's Famous Radio Personality, act the part in every way. Male or female

HOW TO BE THE HOST WITH THE MOST! Speak into the microphone with a self assured, professional voice.

Lively and cheerful, Sky Bird guides groups on and off stage, announces commercials, music, radio show segments.

The Host With The Most is funny, full of silly patter and yet introduces serious interviews with care.

WHO IS SKY BIRD AND WHY IS HE/SHE WORKING AT H.A.L.O. RADIO? Sky Bird is Heaven's famous radio personality, God's own angel with pizzaz and a message. This fictional radio station is coming straight from Heaven to an Earthly audience.

WHAT TO WEAR! Wear a 1940's style fedora hat with tinsel encircling the crown. A white dress shirt and bow tie look great. Wear headphones around the neck. Speak into a microphone on the news desk.

Sky Bird holds segments together with humor and insight. Read from the full script. Rehearse aloud to become familiar with the program.

Enjoy being the quirky radio host. Take the audience on a fun journey to Bethlehem as the breaking story of "Baby Jesus" develops. There's no time like Christmas to release your inner "Ham".





Encounters Ministries

H.A.L.O. STAGE MANAGER



H.A.L.O. Stage Manager is the trusty angel sidekick to Sky Bird. This person does not speak...at all!

The Stage Manager holds up signs at appropriate times during the program encouraging the audience to respond.

SIGNS: Print large signs and back each one with cardboard.

HALO! APPLAUSE! BOO! WILD CHEERNG OH-H-H-H! YUM!

Hold the appropriate sign high overhead and encourage the audience to respond enthusiastically.

HOW DOES AN ANGEL STAGE MANAGER DRESS? Wear slacks, long sleeved dress shirt, suspenders and a baseball cap trimmed with a tinsel halo. Wings or no wings!



On The Air! THE PRELUDE

Church musicians (organ/piano/keyboard) play Christmas music as the audience gathers.

If using our original music, consider having the same songs played so the audience hears the melodies and become familiar with the choruses.

\mathbf{THE}

PROCESSION

Gather H.A.L.O....On The Air participants in an outer room. Dim sanctuary lights. Existing holiday lights are left burning.

Light stage lights and spot lights so people can read their parts.

As participants file to their seats, the audience sings a Christmas Carol of your choice or the group may sing the theme song if you have purchased it.

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SOMEWHERE BETWEEN HEAVEN AND EARTH RADIO READER INTRODUCTION

Radio Readers stand across the stage speaking into microphones.

No costumes.

ADULTS: Adults who may remember these authentic old radio show introductions are the best readers. Read each introduction like the real radio characters.

If few folks are available, read back and forth with enthusiasm. If there are lots of people, assign one introduction per person.

MAN: Good evening Mr. And Mrs. America., from border to border and coast to coast..and all the ships at sea. Let's go to press."

(Walter Winchell)

WOMAN: (Shouting) "Henry, Henry Aldrich!"
YOUNG MAN:(Shouting/high voice) "Coming Mother."
(The Aldrich Family)

MAN: (This is 'The Breakfast Club' original theme song..sing it if you know it! Speak it if you don't.) "Good morning Breakfast Clubbers, good morning to ya'. We woke up bright and early to howdy do ya.'"

(Speak) ...a get together time for all of us who smile before breakfast and then can't break the habit all day long-a place to come to when a feller needs a friend. (Don McNeal's Breakfast Club)

MAN: When the blue of the night meets the gold of the day.... (Bing Crosby)

SKY BIRD:(Sitting at news desk) Halo, Everybody, Halo! H.A.L.O. RADIO IS..ON THE AIR! This is your host with the most, your king of swing, your angelic relic, your jolly dolly, your fine-benign-divine-design! Yes, it's me, God's own favorite radio personality, Sky Bird, coming straight from H.A.L.O. radio studios, One Paradise Parkway, somewhere just outside of heaven. Be very quiet and you might hear the brush of an angel's wing.

H.A.L.O.

Stay tuned to 777 FM and 1225 AM on your Heavenly Radio Dial. It's the Holy Land Network and it's time to say "Halo!"

STAGE MANAGER SIGN: HALO! AUDIENCE SHOUTS: HALO!

(Sky Bird rings a bell or a series of chimes like N-B-C chimed musical notes. Suggestion: First four notes to "Hallelujah" from Handel's Messiah.)

Our Angel producers report that H.A.L.O.'s field reporters are in position for the most significant news story in human history. While connecting to satellites, let me introduce our Sponsor.

SPONSOR COMMERCIAL: (Sky Bird or Another Person) He's Someone you know well. He is the One and Only, All Knowing, All Wise, Sovereign, Holy, Powerful, Faithful, Patient, Merciful, and yes, our Sponsor is all that and He is also Love. That's right people, our Sponsor is God, AKA: Loving Heavenly Father.

Some of us know Him by His smile and others believe God "is" because of His Word. God's Word...the best selling book sold in bookstores across Planet Earth. Go out and get one today, the B-I-B-L-E yes, that's the book for me! Now, back to our program.

Students (Birth-Age 3), teacher(s) and parents participate in this segment. Since these young students cannot speak, adults interact while carrying them. Parent or Helper presents MORNING ZOO COMMERCIAL.

COSTUMES: Dress as various animals. Consider sleepers with tails attached, hats with little ears, borrowed Halloween costumes.

Little ones carry stuffed animals. (Sheep, dogs, cats, donkeys, camels, cows, etc.) Helpers assist by carrying children, speaking, singing, and holding hands while on stage.

SKY BIRD: Try me.

TEACHER: I'll do better than that. I'll let you listen.

CHILDREN AND HELPERS: Make sounds of sheep (Baa), cows (Moo), donkeys (Hee-Haw).

SKY BIRD: Ahh, yes! It's time for.. THE MORNING ZOO! STABLE Brought to you by the good folks at ENVIRONMENT and "Crazy Ollie's Rent-A-Camel".

TEACHER: We are standing in the middle of a-a-a stable. Smells terrible! It's dark here except for one star that seems to be shining overhead. The animals appear to be comforted by it's brightness.

If you listen closely, you can hear the animals singing.

(No accompaniment needed for this familiar nursery song. Teacher and helpers help these little ones sing. If all children are too small, ask audience to help you sing.)

STAGE MANAGER: HOLD SIGN "OH-H-H!" AUDIENCE: OH-H-H!

CHILDREN AND HELPERS: Moo! Baa! Hee Haw!

HELPER/PARENT: Can you hear me in the studio? There appear to be a great number of people passing by the stable. They are hurrying here and there. No one is paying attention to the animals.

TEACHER: Do you have any information about what is going on here today? Wait! I see a young couple speaking to the Innkeeper. He's pointing this direction and....

CHILDREN AND HELPERS: Moo! Baa! Hee Haw!

SKY BIRD: Hello? Hello? Are you there? We seem to have lost our satellite. Thank you MORNING ZOO.

This is H.A.L.O. RADIO..ON THE AIR at 777 FM and 1225 AM on your radio dial. It's time to say "Halo"!

HEROD: I, King Herod the Great, address my subjects today on a matter of utmost importance. I was recently informed of a child being born in the area of Bethlehem who's family is claiming that the child is the King of the Jews.

Must I remind you that Herod the Great is the only King of the Jews? Is it not Herod that rebuilt your Temple? Have I not given you wealth and stability in all my years of rule?

I am not a king to be trifled with. I will be king over the body of this child, rumored to be born in Bethlehem and called "King of the Jews".
