Dedegumo If you've been looking for an excuse to ditch your Swatch and drop some cash on a seriously cool watch, get your wrist to this Kyoto, Japan import. Forget mass-market timepieces: Each Dedegumo watch is handcrafted by trained artisans, right in the small but sophisticated shop. Dudes will dig triple-leather-band statement pieces featuring large watch faces with aluminum backgrounds that have been burned for texture (\$437), as well as wide-band styles with dartboard-looking faces (\$419). Glittering Conscience pop-up Socially conscious shoppers should beeline it to this temporary store, where everything inside is sustainably made. The owners of green brands Ruff & Cut, Arm Candy and NatureVsFuture organized the space into mini boutiques for 20 eco-friendly home-goods, clothing and accessories designers to display their wares. Support Mother Nature by snagging Vance Kitira picture frames made from sustainable teak (four for \$98), NatureVsFuture asymmetrical wool coats (\$478) and Ruff & Cut recycled gold pendants with ethically produced rough-cut diamonds (\$1,840). **95 W Houston St between La Guardia Blvd and Thompson St (646-455-0164), Mon-Sat 11am-9pm, Sun noon-7pm. Lampe Berger pop-up This renowned French home-

fragrance company, once enjoyed by famous folks like Pablo Picasso and Jean Cocteau, has finally brought its entire collection to one U.S. location at this chic Madison Avenue pop-up. The store's all-white interior has plum-colored carpet and is stacked with lamps that resemble—and double as—immense French perfume bottles, to be filled with the scent of your choice, including wild orchid, eucalyptus and Borneo teakwood (500ml) \$20, 1 liter \$35). Styles vary, from painted porcelain Nico & Nicolas lamps (\$140) to **Jewel-toned glass Carat versions (\$75)**. Poundcake NYC Pop-Up Jewelry designer Anna Badoian wanted to open a boutique that not only provided a platform for her artsy crew to share their goods, but also served as a place to encourage creativity. The result is a gallery-cum-shop that offers hand-selected pieces created by local artists, each of whom has a personal connection to the shopkeeper. Huge, gritty photos by

Peter Beste represent the family-like rap scene in Houston (\$400-\$1,100 for large prints from an edition of two), while Badoian's own jewelry includes popular **GO FLY YOURSELF** bracelets (\$130) and sterling-silver leaf ear cuffs (\$250). **Father Panik Industries'** cozy mittens scribbled with two-word sayings, like **BAD ASS** and **FREE REX** (\$32-\$34), and **Time Will Tell** plastic kitsch watches (\$65) are colorful boys, fit for any fun-spirited fashionista. **242 Elizabeth St between E Houston and Prince Sts (212-470-4866, poundcakenyc.com), Mon noon-7pm, Tue-Sat 11am-8pm, Sun noon-7pm. tenoverten Friends Nadine Ferber and Adair Ilyinsky conceived this manicure haven after years of being frustrated with cold, inhospitable NYC nail salons. Ferber, the owner of West Village clothing boutique Mick Marg, and Ilyinsky, a former financial analyst for Coach, teamed up to open a neighborhood nail salon with a twist: Patrons can play with iPads, available at every manicure station. Vintage lighting fixtures and

comfy pedicure chairs make the salon feel homey, and most of the beauty offerings are all-natural, chemical-free RGB polishes. Treat yourself to pedicures with foot exfoliation (\$65), manicures with moisturizing hand massages (\$20) and bikini waxes (\$30). Thomas Sires Former publicist Fiona Thomas and fashion designer Allison Sires combined their names and talents to create Thomas Sires, a women's clothing and gift shop in Nolita. In addition to designing their own fashion line, the duo travels the world in search of inspiration and interesting knickknacks to fill their cozy, pale brick-walled shop. Percussive leopard-print, gathered tops (\$250); Otto oversize Lucite necklaces (\$325); **Colombian canaflecho fiber spiral bracelets (\$18 each)**; and Japanese fish-shaped soaps-on-a-rope (\$40).
