The Michael Michaud Jewellery Collection, designed by Michael Michaud, is a world renowned collection of botanical jewellery. It captures the beauty and exquisite detail of nature using soft patinas on bronze accented with pearls, beads, coral and stones. His exacting attention to detail gives you true to nature, botanical jewellery.

This unique jewellery is made by creating moulds directly from botanical elements in a process similar to lost-wax casting. While traditional lost-wax casting begins with a hand-carved model of wax, Michael Michaud instead uses an actual leaf, branch or flower in place of the wax model. A mould is created around the botanical element and as it is heated the plant matter burns away and leaves behind a beautifully detailed mould of itself.

Michael Michaud Jewellery is renowned for its beauty and workmanship and is featured in the finest museums, galleries and speciality retailers around the world. Many collections are commissioned by leading museums such as The Victoria & Albert Museum, The Art Institute of Chicago, The National Gallery of Art and the Château de Versailles.

Artist Michael Michaud attended the Rochester Institute of Technology's prestigious school for American craftsmen, where he studied under designers Hans Christenson and Gary Griffin and became a master in the creation and manipulation of moulds. After graduating in 1980, Michael Michaud continued to perfect his craft while working under jewellery designers in the New York City area. In 1991, he found himself working in New York City's flower district and living in the beautiful Connecticut countryside - his love of the natural beauty that surrounded him began to blend with his passion for creating jewellery which led to the birth of Michael Michaud Jewellery.

ACORN & CHARM

The acorn is the harbinger of new life. Acorns were used extensively as a food source for native North American Indians, and also roasted as a coffee substitute. It is also important for local wildlife populations. The acorn fruit has been recognized in country medicine for relieving chilblains and frostbite. The acorn is also found in Michael Michaud's interpretation of the classic charm looks of the 1950s. With charms of maple, apple, pinecone, Japanese maple, oak, acorn, ginkgo and clover, he has combined an enduring fashion statement.

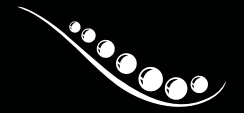

BIRCH BARK

The Paper Birch, slender and elegant, with its intensely white bark, is visible even in the dark of night. The tough outer wrapping of the tree is the bark from which American Indians fashioned their strong, lightweight bark canoes. These Native Americans, as well as early colonists and European herbalists, all agreed that birch leaves were therapeutic and all prescribed them for many disorders. The leaves and twigs of some birches boast a spicy aroma and are used to make scented oil. Because of their singular beauty, they have been designated National Memorial Trees for Mothers and as such were planted on the Capitol grounds in Washington, DC.

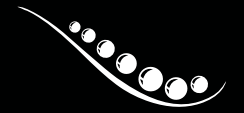

BLACKCURRANT

Blackcurrant is a small shrub growing to 1 to 2 meters tall. The fruit is an edible berry, very dark purple to black in colour. During WW II fruits rich in Vitamin C like oranges, became almost impossible to obtain in the UK. As Blackcurrant berries are a rich source of Vitamin C, and the climate for growing them is excellent, the government encouraged cultivation and it gave rise to the everlasting popularity of blackcurrants there. Today they're a favorite in jellies, syrups, cordials and in cooking for sauces and desserts.

BLEEDING HEART

The Bleeding Heart is a perennial herbaceous plant. The name comes from the heart-shaped pendulous flowers which have a longer inner petal that extends below the 'heart'. It is a popular ornamental plant for flower gardens in temperate climates. Bleeding Hearts usually reach a height of 2' to 3' with a similar spread.

BLUE CORNFLOWER

The Cornflower is a small annual flowering plant in the family Asteraceae, native to Europe. It flowers from June until August. Flanders Field in Belgium, best known for the red poppy, is also home to the Blue Cornflower. In France it is the symbol of the 11th of November 1918 armistice and, as such, a common symbol for veterans (especially the front line French soldier).

FLOWERING MYRTLE

Flowers are born in summer and autumn in panicles of crinkled flowers with crepe-like texture. Colors vary from deep purple to red to white, with almost every shade in between. The fruit is a capsule, green and succulent at first, then ripening to dark brown or black dryness. Flowering Myrtles can fill every landscape need, from tidy street trees to dense barrier hedges. It is common in Southern France, the Iberian Peninsula, Italy and in milder climates in the US.

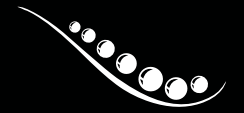

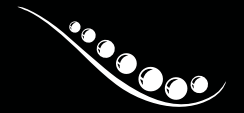

JINGLE SHELLS

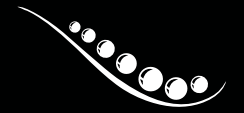

The family is known by several common names including jingle shells, saddle oysters and mermaid's toenails. 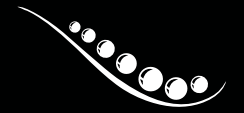

Throughout history Orange Blossom flowers have symbolized purity, innocence, chastity and fertility. In 1684 Louis XIV transferred from Fontainebleau to Versailles and, fond of their sweet scent and gorgeous white flowers, installed his Orangerie. He insisted that even in the middle of January baskets of orange blossoms perfume the rooms. Because they partly symbolize fertility, the flowers have been considered ideal adornments for brides.

These annuals prefer cool weather and mature early. The "peas" inside the pod are considered berries by botanists. Common folklore regarding peas is that if you count the number of peas in a pod the crop will fail. Pennsylvanian Germans always planted peas under the sign of Gemini, hoping to get two for one and double pods.

QUAKING ASPEN

The quaking aspen is the glory of autumn. It is most abundant in the American West, where it grows the tallest and where the autumn splendour of its leaves is most brilliant. Glowing in all shades of gold, the leaves flutter incessantly in the wind because of their uniquely flattened stems. 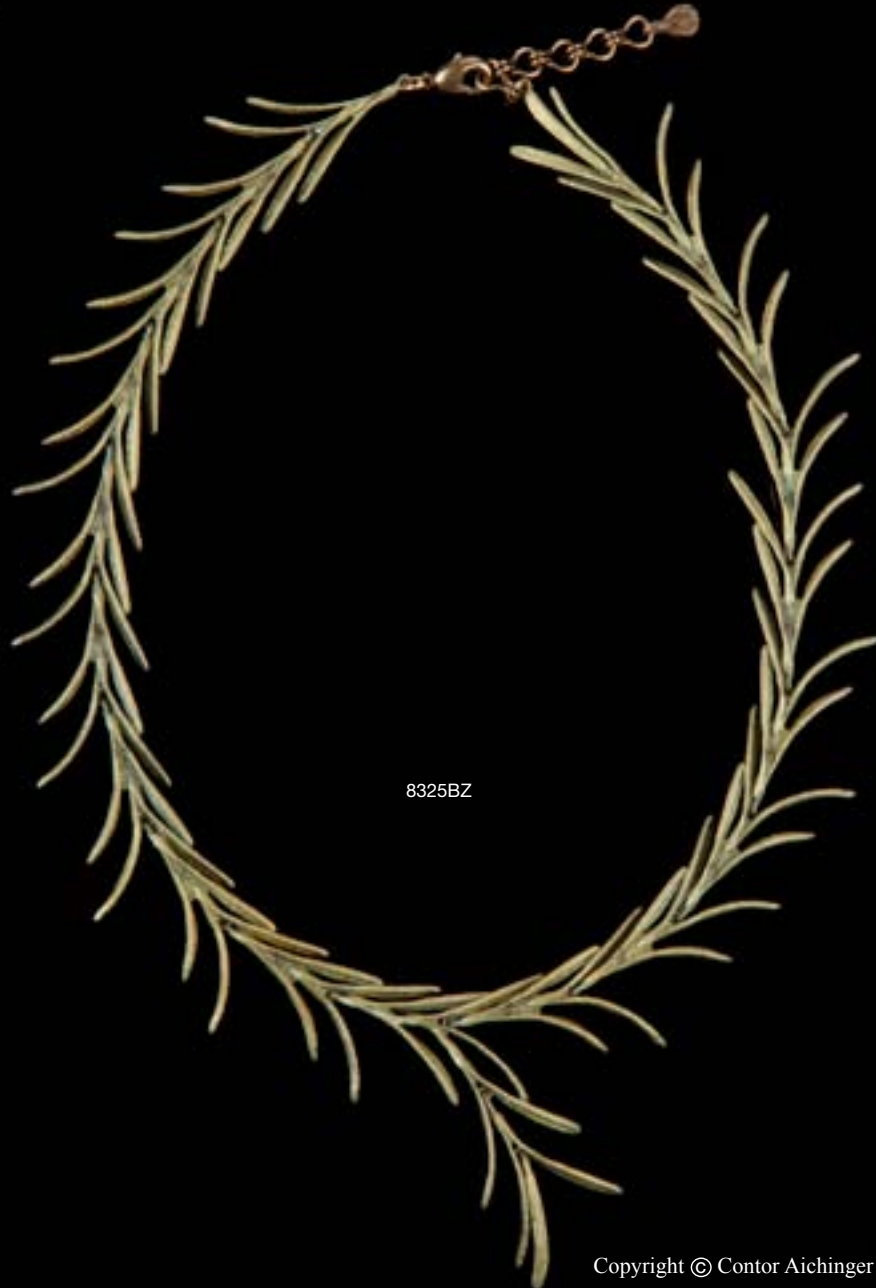

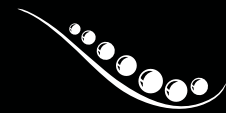

SEA URCHIN

Sea Urchins are members of the phylum Echinodermata that also includes starfish and sea cucumbers. They have fivefold symmetry, which is called pentamerism and is easily seen in the dried shell of the urchin. They move by means of hundreds of tiny, transparent, adhesive "tube" feet and sometimes the most visible sign of life is the spines. The spines serve to protect the urchin from predators. Sea urchin "roe" is traditionally considered an aphrodisiac and is consumed either raw or briefly cooked. In Japanese sushi cuisine it is called "uni".

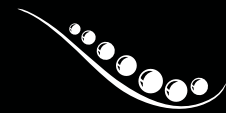
