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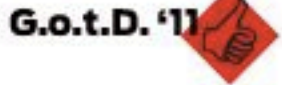

Casual jersey for those who don't need logos
While some cyclists aspire to plaster themselves with corporate logos, Jonathan Schneider wasn't one of them. The Florida cyclist founded Road Holland in 2010 with the goal of making clothes that are "stylish, comfortable, and versatile enough to wear off the bike." Accordingly, the American-made Aalsmeer is more preppy than pro. The cut is feminine and fitted—it nips in at the waist—yet not constricting, and provides ample low-back coverage. The 79% polyester, 21% wool fabric is soft against the skin, and will set you apart from the sea of shiny spandex-clad riders, especially if you go for the Dutch orange. You also get a full zipper, three rear pockets with a zippered stash pocket, and stylish touches like a patterned inside collar for just the right amount of flair. Would I wear it off the bike? In certain situations—if I'd ridden to a bar, for instance—yes; but I wouldn't grab it when getting dressed for work in the morning.— *Emily Furia*
