Rare. 'We are at this present writing little better than a community of madmen. The sudden discovery of gold, scattered in bewildering profusion, over the face of our adopted country, has caused a simultaneous rush, by all but a small minority from their ordinary occupations . . .'

Scarce account of the author's courageous 'peace expedition' across Arnhem Land in December 1933, after five Japanese and a policeman had been killed by Aborigines of Caledon Bay, in the Gulf of Carpentaria. Not in Greenway. \$200-300
