



Holley's Keyhole Scarf

simply stunning

Materials:

1 skein of Plymouth DeAire, Berroco Peruvia Quick or Brown Sheep Burly Spun
One set of size US 11 or 13 knitting needles
Stitch holder

Optional Accessories:

Broach or pin

Abbreviations

K knit
P purl

Pattern Instructions

Using Long Tail method (or any stretchy cast on method) cast on 20 stitches.

Work in K1, P1 for 4-6 inches.

Work the keyhole:

Knit the first stitch then place the next stitch on the holder and repeat this across the row. You should now have 10 stitches on your needle and 10 stitches on a stitch holder. With the 10 stitches on your needle work in stockinette stitch for 10 rows. The last row you work should be a purl row. Now move these stitches to a stitch holder and cut yarn leaving a 6" tail.

Now you're going to knit 10 rows of stockinette stitch on the remaining 10 stitches that are on your stitch holder. To begin, move these stitches from your stitch holder back onto your knitting needle. Join in a new piece of yarn and work these 10 stitches in stockinette stitch for 10 rows. The last row you work should be a purl row. Do not cut yarn.

Next, you're going to transfer all 20 stitches back onto one needle. To do this slip one stitch from your needle, then slip one stitch from your stitch holder. Repeat this process across the row until all stitches are on one needle.

Continue working in K1, P1 for 22 inches.

Bind off all stitches and weave in ends.
