TOYOTA KARNATAKA GOLF FESTIVAL

David D'Souza (37 points, 0-5 handicap category), Utpal Desai (37 points, 6-10 handicap), Balasabrumanya R. (42 points, 11-15 handicap), Sudhir Krishnaswamy (41 points, 16-20 handicap) and Rajiv Sethi (38 points, 21-24 handicap) grabbed the five Indian spots at the World Golfers Championship (WGC), to be played across Cotswold Downs GC, Durban Country Club, Prince's Grant GC and Umhlanga Country Club in South Africa from October 26 to November 2 this year by emerging triumphant in their respective categories at the Toyota Karnataka Golf Festival held last month at KGA GC as a qualifier to the WGC.
