Pilot Butte 6 Training Scenario 2

Scenario #2 Rescue Scenario trapped victim in upstairs offices. (A good late afternoon/early evening drill).

Two engine companies and a medic or two engine companies and 365.

Companies are responding to a report of heavy smoke and fire at the Pilot Butte 6 movie theater. The first engine arrives on scene to find heavy smoke in the entire theater building. The smoke is banked down to about 4 feet from the floor. There is no fire visible. The theater has been evacuated.

Action:

1st engine on scene should extend line into the building and attempt to determine where the fire is and make an attack. (the fire will be found in theater #5, heavy fire involving seats and curtains with lots of black smoke)

2nd company (medic or 365) should arrive two minutes later and assist with fire attack.

On arrival of the 3^{rd} engine company (5 minutes later), there is a report to the IC of a manager who is not accounted for and may be in the upstairs offices. Access is in the lobby, behind the front counters. 3^{rd} arriving company is to search this area for the victim.

Special rules: No flashlights allowed for search.

Crews can use TIC and may choose either a hose line or rope to search from.

The fire was extinguished but dense, black smoke remains upstairs.

Removal of the victim is not necessary.

This is a search scenario but all hose lines should be wet.

Do not spray water.

When completed, rotate crews and perform a second rescue. Prior to starting the second evolution, the victim should be moved to new location by original search company and others should not enter the upstairs until they have had an opportunity to be on a search crew.
