

The round top kabuki brush is best used for mineral makeup and powder application. It can be used with all makeup types (including liquids and creams) but is best in working with minerals and powder finishes. The round top kabuki also works well with blushes, bronzers and finishing powders. If you'd like to use the kabuki brush for more than just mineral powder, consider purchasing a second one, keeping one for powder use only.

How to Use for Mineral or Powder Application

Though the round kabuki can be used with any type of foundation (liquid, mineral, cream, powder, or mousse), it's most commonly used with mineral makeup for all over face application or with blush or bronzer to buff out over the contours of your face.

How to use the round kabuki for mineral foundation application:

- 1. Always wash hands before makeup application.
- 2. Dab brush into product and be sure to tap the brush against the edge of the container before application to remove any excess product.
- 3. For blush/bronzer: Apply in a downward sweeping motion starting at corner of eye and blend up from apples of your cheeks. For foundation: Start at forehead and buff product on in a circular motion moving down to chin and jawline
- 4. For medium- full coverage, keep building layers of powder until you've achieved the desired look.
- 5. Cleanse and rinse your brush.
- 6. Let brush air dry in an open space.

Here's a quick tip on using your Round Kabuki from our Cosmetologist: Apply minerals over foundation to set the foundation; this will give you longer lasting makeup throughout day.

How to Clean

We recommend cleaning your makeup brush before using it the first time.

For daily cleaning, consider using a daily brush cleaner, or makeup remover wipes.

We recommend deep cleaning your makeup brushes weekly using the following method:

- 1. Holding bristles face down, run bristles under warm water.
- 2. Gently squeeze out any excess water and makeup residue.
- 3. Apply a dime size amount of mild soap and olive oil into the palm of your hand.
- 4. Massage the bristles into your palm in a circular motion under running water until the water runs clear, being careful NOT to submerge the brush.
- 5. Gently squeeze out any excess water using a clean towel.
- 6. Let the bristles air dry in an open space.

IMPORTANT: Do not submerge the makeup brush/bristles in water; avoid getting moisture in the ferrule (metal part) as it can settle and cause loose bristles and or handle.

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
