



The Triple Threat Combo is made up of three components:

The ESCA Lure Light – needs no batteries...saltwater makes it work.

WhoopAss Jig – 2 ounce or 3 ounce bucktail jig

Project X Scented Swimbait

Rigging:

Remove the treble hook from the ESCA's split ring. It's easy to do with split-ring pliers, or just by using your fingernail to open the gap. Be careful, the treble hook is very sharp. And leave the split ring on the ESCA.

Then attach the WhoopAss jig to either of the split rings on the ESCA. Again, split-ring pliers or just your fingernail will get the job done.

Finally, thread the Project X bait onto the jig hook. Be sure not to go too far down the body of the plastic. You want to leave a lot of the body/tail showing behind the bucktail, and you do not want to 'choke' down the gap of the hook. Too much body at the hook bend may prevent a solid hook-up.

Technique:

You can use this on your Ready Rod to cast to a cruising cobia, dolphin, or amberjack. You can slow troll it as you are drifting across likely spots. You can vertically jig it like a butterfly jig. This is a very effective combo for lock-jawed grouper and snapper. Drop it to the bottom and then retrieve in small, steady jerks. You can also use the ESCA as part of your other trolling rigs...works very well inside a feather jig, a sea witch or Ilander lure. Don't worry that the ESCA is 'concealed', the fish will sense the electromagnetic field it creates. And although the light mimics the bioluminescence of squid, jellyfish and shrimp, the ESCA works really well in bright light conditions too.
