PRINT THIS DOCUMENT AT THE CORRECT SIZE.

This document is designed to be printed on a U.S. Letter-sized sheet of paper which measures 8.5" wide x 11" high.

When printing, make sure your printer's setting indicate "Page Scaling: None" or "Print at 100%". Do not print on the setting "Fit to page".

To confirm you have printed this document correctly, use our coin matcher circles.

Place a quarter, nickel or dime in its proper circle. If the coin's size matches the circle, you have printed this document correctly.

SIZING YOUR FINGER.

Place your intended ring finger flat on this document, in between the marked lines of each indicated ring size. Find the size that your finger matches comfortably within. Remember, when wearing a ring it will have to pass over your finger's joint—the widest area of your finger-so make sure you size your finger at the joint as well as closer to your hand.

SIZING A RING.

Using a ring you have determined that fits your intended ring finger correctly, place that ring in between the marked lines of each indicated ring size. Examine the inside edges of your ring (the diameter of your ring's size) and see which ring size they match most closely to.





Helpful

TAKE YOUR TIME.

Make sure you print this document correctly.

Take into consideration a size smaller or size larger after you think you've determined your size It is often best to go larger than smaller, but your comfort is most important. Try on other rings you have to experiment and decide which you are most comfortable wearing.

ALSO EXAMINE THE WIDTH OF THE RING. A wider ring may fit past the joint of your finger, but can feel tight if it sits closer to the joint. A thinner ring will sit closer to your hand, and may feels looser. Move a ring up and down your finger to see where it feel most comfortable to help you decide.
