



# diy Table Number: Vintage Plate

## ingredients . . . . .

### TOOLS YOU'LL NEED

- vintage plate (one per table)
- pencil
- tracing paper
- paper (one table number printed on each sheet)
- scissors
- removable glue dots — *or* — double sided tape
- plate stands (one per plate)

### GET CREATIVE WITH

- mixing & matching plates
- creative table names instead of numbers
- typography

## step-by-step . . . . .

### STEP #1

Place a plate on top of tracing paper & trace around the bottom of the plate with a pencil.

### STEP #2

Layer the tracing paper on top of one of the sheets of paper printed with a table number. Be sure to center the table number inside the traced circle.

### STEP #3

Using the traced circle as a guide, cut the circle out of both sheets of paper. It may be necessary to tape the tracing paper to printed sheet in order to prevent shifting when cutting.

*NOTE: The tracing paper circle can be re-used to guide cutting subsequent table numbers.*

### STEP #4

Apply removable glue dots or double sided tape to the reverse side of the circle with the table number printed on it & adhere it to the center of the plate.

### STEP #5

Repeat steps #1-4 with each plate.

### STEP #6

Place one plate in a plate stand on each table. Enjoy the party!



# diy Table Number: Wood Slice

## ingredients . . . . .

### TOOLS YOU'LL NEED

wood slices (various sizes available at Dick Blick)  
transfer film (e.g. Grafix Rub-onz Transfer Film)  
xacto knife  
scissors  
plate holders

### GET CREATIVE WITH

fonts  
use words in lieu of numbers

## step-by-step . . . . .

### STEP #1

Follow instructions on the transfer film package.\*

### STEP #2

Place one wood slice in a plate holder on each table. Cheers!

*\*Instruction will vary depending upon the transfer film that you purchase. The one that I bought had wonderfully detailed step-by-step instruction that I could not possibly improve upon.*



# diy Table Number: Glass Pitcher

## ingredients . . . . .

### TOOLS YOU'LL NEED

glass pitchers (one per table)  
vinyl numbers (available at art supply stores)

### GET CREATIVE WITH

glass pitcher & bottle shapes  
festive drinks to fill the pitchers

## step-by-step . . . . .

### STEP #1

Wash & dry each glass pitcher.

NOTE: *Vinyl numbers stick best to a clean surface.*

### STEP #2

Peel a vinyl number off of the sheet & carefully place it on the pitcher.

### STEP #3

Fill with sangria (or another festive drink!) & place one on each table. Divertiti!
