The really thrilling news, however, is that Aron does not appear to have brain damage, and is, in fact, one of our brightest toddlers. He speaks clearly and recites poems already! Thank you so much for caring about Aron and making his progress possible!

After telling you about Aron, I wish I could just close on this positive note. But, I'm compelled to also tell you some news that is not as happy. **As I write, conditions in Sierra Leone are becoming more and more difficult.** Fuel and food prices are rising incredibly, with fuel at over \$8 a gallon. On top of that, there is a fuel shortage, and the rainy season has already begun.

This means an increased need for fuel and more money for repairs and other necessities. We have also had to increase the transportation allowance for our workers, so that they can continue to show up for work.
