Austin Tilly - 9th Survey Reg. RA, 1st Corps. 1942

The Tilly was the name given to a number of British vehicles produced during WWII based on civilian car designs, adapted for use by each of the armed forces across all areas during the conflict. The key vehicles used were the Austin, Hillman, Morris and Standard. The Austin Tilly is the subject of the latest piece of new tooling in the Oxford Military range. Tilly was the nickname derived from the term Utility and these hybrid vehicles proved especially versatile, fitted with a simple rear loading area. Very few remain today but they can be seen in military museums at home and abroad, including the Yorkshire Air Museum, the Muckleburgh Collection and overseas in the Ta Kali Museum in Malta. the French Regional Air Museum at Angers-Marce and the Czech Republic tank museum just outside Prague. The Tilly Register logs all 'finds', with members cross

The newly tooled Oxford model appears in a drab green/black camouflage scheme with a 'canvas' back and distinctive wartime markings on the front, back and sides. headlight lenses, door handles, petrol cap, radiator slits and even the shaft of the spade. The Oxford miniature will be of special interest to WWII military enthusiasts, as well as being an unusual addition to a vehicle collection of the period.

company, is well known for its tractors. Its original purpose was the design and manufacture of gear systems, specialising in machine cut gears. In 1902, it moved to the Park Works in the West Yorkshire town, where David Brown Engineering Ltd remains today as a leading

supplier of heavy transmission systems. The Brown family were involved in DBT right up to 1990, when they sold their stake to the management who subsequently floated the DBT group as a public company.

The David Brown Tractor, which Oxford have tooled up this year, is from the 1950s era and this particular version was used by the RAF for the purpose of towing aircraft. Liveried in the RAF's Middle Bronze Green, it also features the RAF roundels on the back with its official RAF number 89377 and B/5 markings. Although in 1:76 scale, it will sit well on an Oxford Aviation airfield of the era, alongside your 1:72 scale military aircraft of the day.

Military 2 Piece Pack (AEC Matador/Bedford MWD)

This two-piece set contains a pair of the most used military workhorses from WWII. First is the AEC Matador Heavy AA Tractor which is decorated in a US Army livery of the 317 Btty, 165th Regiment, as used in Germany in 1945. The vehicle has an Olive Drab body and cab – also reflected in the wheel inserts - and features a 'canopied' back in Quarry Grey. The vehicle number is printed on the rear tailgate and on the offside door only. The US Military Star is printed in white on the roof of the cab for identification from the air and the model also benefits from a mass of detailed military markings in blue, red, yellow, beige and white.

The second model in the set is the Bedford MWD as used by the 5th Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment, 43rd Wessex Infantry Division, in Holland during 1945. Also in Olive Drab, the vehicle has a slightly lighter drab green 'canvas back' and Olive Drab chassis and wheel inserts. Regimental insignia feature on the front and the rear and the vehicle number is printed on the offside of the bonnet and the rear tailgate only.

The set is typical of the vehicles that would have been used by Allied land forces in the lead-up to the end of the WWII in Europe in 1945. Following the end of the war, many of these vehicles passed into civilian use where they continued in service for a good many years.

Field Marshall Tractor - Marshall Green

This newly tooled farm tractor is modelled on the Field Marshall produced post 1945 and comes in their signature green colour scheme. The Lincolnshire based company of Marshall, Sons & Co started manufacturing tractors in 1930, the year which saw the launch of the single cylinder Marshall 15/30. The Field Marshall - a much improved tractor was introduced immediately after WWII with the Series I (1945-1947). Series 2 followed between 1947 and 1949, Series 3 (1949-1953) and finally Series 3A (1953-1957). Up to the time of Series 3, which had an optional electric starter, the starting mechanism was by present standards, quite antiquated. The method comprised a smouldering piece of paper containing saltpetre, which was inserted into the cylinder head by means of a special screw-in holder in the cylinder head. The driver then had to crank up the engine with a starting handle.

The main uses for the Field Marshall Tractor included pulling agricultural machinery from place to place, such as threshing machines. They were a familiar sight, used as a



power plant with a belt pulley coupled by a large flat drive belt to the pulley of the secondary machine.

Ford Zephyr - Tuscan Yellow

This version of the Ford Zephyr 6
was made between 1962 and 1966,
during which time over 105,000
were made. The Oxford release,
registration BRL 441C, is modelled on
the four-door option but Ford also made
the car as an estate. The Zephyr, which came with either
a four or six cylinder engine, was assembled in Dagenham
alongside its up-market partner the Ford Zodiac and
shared many common components.

Here at Oxford, we have reproduced in miniature the special characteristics of the Ford Zephyr 6.

Particularly detailed is the long chrome radiator grille.
The wheels have also been given special treatment and the Tuscan Yellow colour scheme is in sharp contrast to the black interior and the wealth of chrome and black masking additions that benefit this charming little model.

Bedford OWB - Southern National

Southern National was a bus company that operated in South West of England between 1929 and 1969 and then again between 1983 and 1999, at which point it was merged into First Group and the name ultimately disappeared.

Our Oxford Southern National
Bedford Bus is decorated in their signature
green and cream and is heading for Padstow long before Rick Stein took residence in the little Cornish
town, we are sure! Registered DOD 556, the bus has
been modelled with the large headlight configuration.
The wheel inserts reflect the green bodywork and the
extensive silver masking even extends to the tax disc

holder. Other exterior features, including the passenger step, mudguards and driver's door mirror are finished in black. The interior is particularly well detailed, too, with 'upholstered' green seats and black steering wheel.



AEC Matador Generator - American Circus

The American Circus was originally founded by Billy Mack in the 1940s. Billy was one of the most colourful characters in the business until his death in 1967. However, his family carried on the circus under the Hoffman's American Circus name for many years and the troupe used a number of demobbed ex-WD AEC Matadors with a variety of bodies. The circus eventually changed its name again and is now known as Uncle Sam's American Circus, famous for its superb fleet of American trucks. Our model, registered VTL 636K, is highly visible in gleaming white with the circus name decorated

with the US Stars and Stripes along the sides.

Albion Horsebox - GWR

The N Gauge - 1:148 scale - Oxford Albion Horsebox has been given a makeover in the famous GWR brown and cream colour scheme and although not an authentic GWR vehicle, this Express Horse Box Hire Service vehicle, numbered HXA 865, could well have transported animals to any station on the Great Western route for their onward journey by rail.

The attractive little model is enlivened even further with bright red wheels and a red flash immediately beneath the cab doors, as well as a great many silver masked features to the sides. The printing even extends across the back of this two-tone truck, completing a highly detailed model, considering its size.




