
Military 2 Piece Pack (AEC Matador/Bedford MWD)

The second is the Bedford MWD as used in Holland during 1945 by the 5th Battalion,

This is another great little model to add to your fairground scene. Pat Collins Funfairs go back as far as 1875 when the founder, Patrick Collins, established a round of fairs in the Black Country. Of Irish descent, Patrick was born in 1859 on a fairground site in Chester, one of five children. During his lifetime he not only established one of the longest surviving Showmen's fairground attractions but he also achieved the status of

being Liberal MP for Walsall and Mayor of Walsall. He was also for a time President of the Showmen's Guild of Great Britain. Pat Collins died in 1943 but the business continued to be run under its original name by his son Patrick Ross Collins, who was born in 1886. Even today, the fair still carries the Pat Collins name, although the company is now owned by another famous name in the fairground fraternity – Anthony Harris and his family.

After the recent introduction of the Motorcycle & Sidecar in both AA and RAC livery, we now see it appear as used by another great British institution, the Royal Mail. The model comes in the signature Post Office red and black, with matt beige saddlebags to carry the mail.

From the inscription the vehicle, registered AXL 938, operated from the MCC Post Office No. 2033 in the Harrow & Wembley postal area and bears the royal cipher GR with the crown above. This latest addition will be of interest to both collectors of period motorcycles, as well as Royal Mail and Post Office enthusiasts.

Exterior detail extends to a mass of silver mask spraying to door handles, exhaust, wheel trims, door mirror indicators, headlights and much more. The front radiator and grilles have been given a special satin black spray wipe process to achieve the totally authentic look of the original. It deserves pride





Renault Dauphine - Red

Our fourth release on the Renault Dauphine is decorated in bright red with a black chassis and lots of silver masking, including the headlights, mirrors, door handles, window surrounds, grilles and bumpers. It has a British registration plate ELO 277 and the detail includes the Renault badge on

Registered BNR 322, the black paintwork on our authentic little VW replica is striking and the gleaming effect is emphasised further by lots of 'chromework' to wheels, door handles, sills and window surrounds. The coach lines along the side, also masked silver,

add a racy yet elegant touch above the ordinary. The rear indicators are also detailed in their authentic red and orange.

A replica of the real car GVP 294N, our 1.8 Super is finished in the colour Blaze, a fiery orange-red with contrasting black and silver bodywork. Our second release off this recently introduced new tool is certainly eye-catching, as well as the body colour, externally the fine authentic detail on the model

The Reliant Regal is almost a cult car in motoring circles, epitomising British eccentricity! Manufactured between 1953-1973 by the Reliant Motor Company in Tamworth, it was surprisingly classed as a tricycle and could be driven with a motorcycle licence instead of a full car licence.

The signature duck egg blue and white of the British Overseas Airways Corporation is reproduced superbly on this little car, which comes complete with the BOAC lettering on the side and its original number plate OGP 844E. It would look good on a civilian aircraft





Scammell Pioneer Recovery Tractor - BOAC

Only the second release on the newly tooled Pioneer, it features an authentic livery - that of the British Overseas Airways Corporation. The famous British airline was formed in 1939. In 1946 it expanded its operations to fly longhaul, merging with British European Airways in 1974 to become what we all know now as British Airways. The model, registered CLM 579H and painted in corporate pale blue, comes with a winch and crane. Additional features include detailed BOAC decals on the side doors, rear lights and a fleet number 177 on the offside front, below the windscreen.













Mabberley coachwork was introduced by Humber as a successor to the Humber 20/65 hp. Between 1948 and 1954, the Pullman was offered with a central partition for chauffeured use and the Oxford version carries this special feature.

King George VI commissioned MXO 143 and our model carries all the details of the original, with particular emphasis on the interior. The dashboard, interior dividing panel and door panels are brown. Seating is grey and the rear shelf is finished in black, as is the dashboard top. Given a contrasting sunshine coloured steering wheel, the inside of the car is finished off in light grey.

The outer body of the car is black with bright silver masking and the wheels wear white wall tyres. One final intricate detail is the Humber badge faithfully replicated in red out of silver.

Jaquar XK150 FHC - Cotswold Blue

Our fifth release on the XKI50 comes as the fixed head coupé version. The Jaguar XK150 was produced between 1957 and 1961 by Jaguar Cars in Coventry. Classed as a sports car, it came as a 2-3 seater coupé as modelled here, a 2-3 seater convertible or a 2-seater roadster, also recently released as an Oxford replica.

Registered 690 KVA, our coupé is painted in Cotswold Blue, complemented by silver masking to window surrounds, bumpers, radiator grille and the spoked wheels.

Inside, the car is even more intricately modelled, with the high level of detail extending to the finely reproduced door

panels and dashboard in pale grey, a slightly darker grey instrument panel and seats, all in contrast to the pale lilac pink 'carpet'. Note the handbrake lever, too, which is fitted to the passenger transmission tunnel.

Edinburgh Tram

The famous madder and white livery associated with Edinburgh public transport goes back to its roots on this double decker closed top tram, which comes with black chassis, roof and pantograph. The interior seating and front and back stairs are all brown and the wheels are finished in silver.

The small scale has not inhibited the reproduction of the fine gold coach lines and printing along the sides, identifying the tram as belonging to the City and Royal Burgh of Edinburgh. The City crest is intricately printed on each side below the lower centre windows. Heading for Churchill on

Route 13, the tram has its fleet number 238 in gold on the front above the silver/black light. This latest Oxford model will appeal to Scottish bus collectors particularly.

MAN TGX D TEC Combi Trailer - NWT

Newell & Wright Transport (NWT) are in the haulage and container service, specialising in freight forwarding. Their predominantly blue and white colour scheme looks simple enough but in 1:76 scale, the level of graphic detail on the tractor unit, the sides and back of the vehicle is amazing. Registered I NWT, the TGX XLX 440 lorry carries the NWT Container Services logo in different formats and colours along the body, in addition to Newell

& Wright being written in full along the narrow flatbed side of the trailer. The trailer back is also well detailed, where the DTEC Combi Trailer marques are finely reproduced. The wheel inserts reflect the main blue of the body, with white outer trim and even the wheel chocks are masked in bright yellow, housed on the blue chassis. Appealing to modern truck enthusiasts, the flatbed Combi Trailer would also look very good with some realistic scale loads.

AEC Matador Wrecker - Bradford City Transport

The latest introduction on the AEC Matador Wrecker takes on the bright yellow/red livery of Bradford City Transport, complete with City crest on the sides and above the cab window at the front. The decoration also includes the depot address of Forster Square, Bradford with its General Manager, Mr E Deakin, M.Inst.T, printed in black just behind the rear nearside door. The chassis is also black. The red winch is housed on a brown-planked effect flatbed and a roof beacon features on the raised section behind the cab. Additional lettering/numbering is printed in red, including the trade plates numbered 065 AK and the

model is rounded off with silver and black masking.

Appealing both to Circus fans and bus enthusiasts, the latest Oxford version of the Bedford OWB bus is decorated in the signature green and red of this famous circus family. The bold yellow lettering along the side carries the name of the troupe, also replicated across the back and on the destination board. Registered WLO 540, the bus is modelled with the large headlight option, while the internal seat configuration replicates the wooden slatted seats with a number of them



Dennis F8 - Northern Ireland Fire Authority

The second release on the newly tooled Dennis F8 comes from the fire authority in Northern Ireland. Finished in red with the usual level of chromework to the body, added detail includes a blue and black beacon, two bells mounted on the roof, hose reels to the rear and decorative and highly colourful crest on the sides of the appliance, where the fine detail even includes the authority motto.

Registered RZ 6927, its identity 'The Ulster' is also printed on the offside front panel adjacent to the chrome finished radiator. It will prove popular with our Irish collectors as well as emergency vehicle enthusiasts generally.


