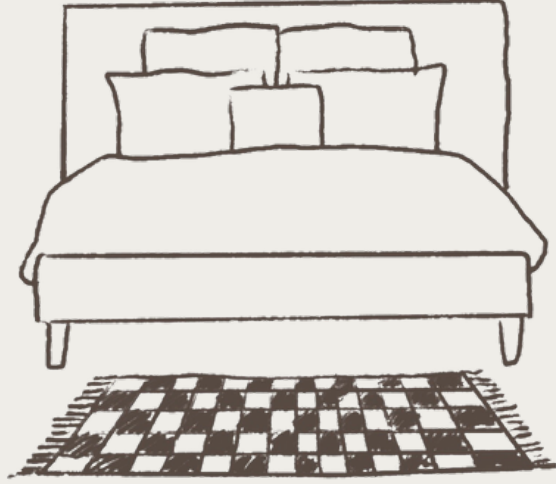

Key Considerations

The following guide will explore key design principles to consider when choosing the ideal placement for your artwork. We will be exploring some of the most popular spaces in the home, the lounge, the bench seat, the console and the bedroom.

Before we dive in here are some key questions to consider...

WALL SPACING:

- How high is your stud? This will impact whether your artwork should be a landscape or portrait orientation. For example, a high stud ceiling could allow you to stack artwork on top of each other and create a gallery wall or a standard height stud might prefer artwork that is longer than it is high.
- How much of your wall space is usable for artwork? generally, you want to fill around 60 - 70% of your wall that is blank (not being covered by furniture or fittings).
- How high should you hang your artwork? generally, artwork should be hung at eye level but of course, we are not all the same height!
- How should I position my artwork above furniture? Typically, the artwork looks best if it is placed in the centre of your piece of furniture. Artwork should not take up more than 2/3 of the length of your piece of furniture.

COLOUR:

- What colours do you have in your interiors? This can be identified through ornaments, cushions, throws, rugs or plants. If you can draw a colour out of your existing interior and match it with a colour in your artwork, it will give your space a cohesive flow and sense of harmony.

FRAMES:

- What distance should you hang your frames from one another? There are no hard and fast rules to this but the recommended distance is 5 - 7cm apart. This will vary with what size pieces you have ie. larger artwork will generally require bigger spaces.
- What colour frame? Consider what accents of colour you have in the room, for example, if you have black window frames or a dark couch you might like to use black frames for your artwork to create a cohesive flow in the room.

REMEMBER... your home is YOUR home and the first port of call is your intuition about your own space. These are guidelines to get you started but feel free to break the norms and have FUN and be creative!

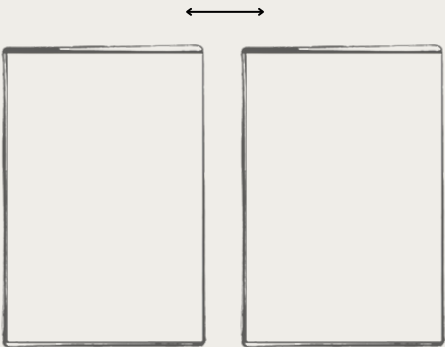

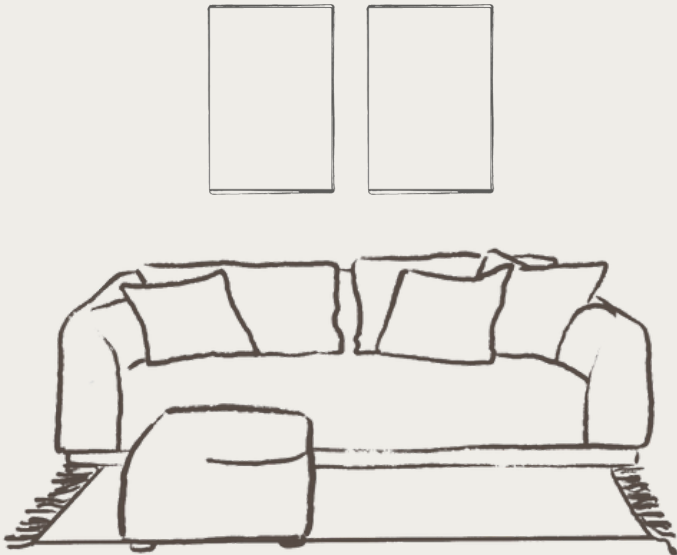
4-seater couch | 3 x A1 frames

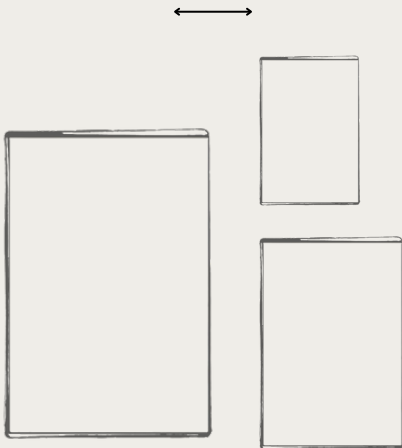

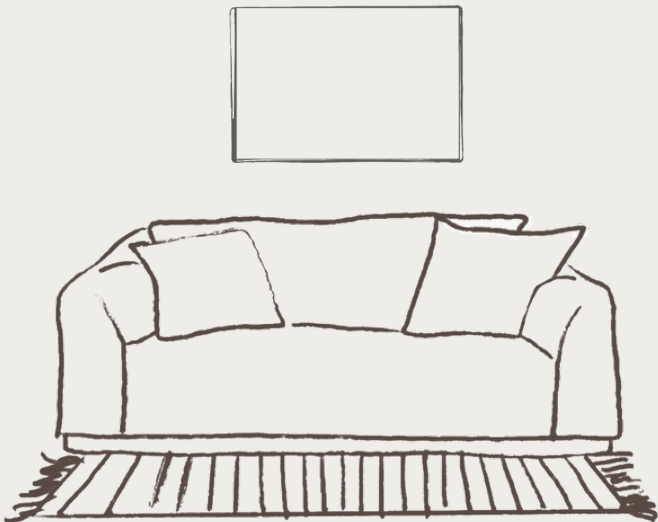
3-seater couch | 2 x A1 frames

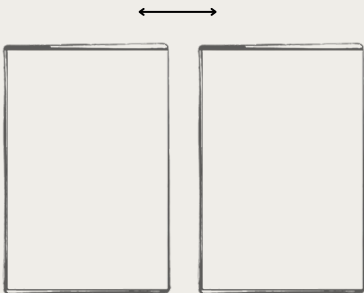
Ao frame, A2 frame and A3 frame

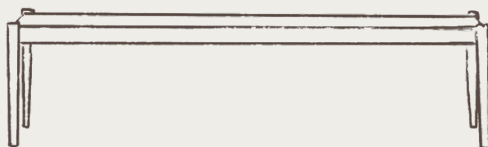
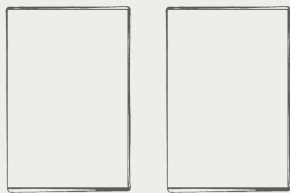
Long bench seat | 1 x 80 x 80cm frame

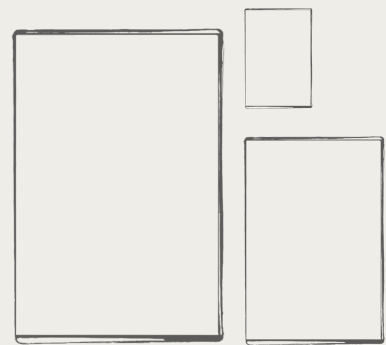

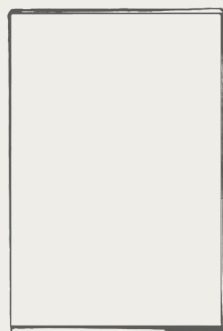
Long bench seat | 2 x A1 frames

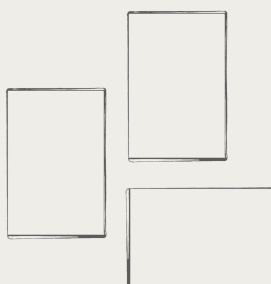
