## **TO PROSPECTIVE JURORS**

This questionnaire is designed to obtain information from you with respect to your qualifications to sit as a juror in this case. By the use of the questionnaire, the process of jury selection will be shortened. Please respond to the following questions as completely as possible. The information contained within the questionnaire will become part of the Court's permanent record, but it will not be distributed to anyone except the attorneys in the case and the judge. During the questioning by the attorneys, you will be given an opportunity to explain or expand any answers, if necessary. If for any reason you do not want to answer any of the questions asked, please write the word, 'PRIVATE', next to the question and we will take this matter up with you in private.

This questionnaire is part of the jury selection process. The questions must be answered by you under penalty of perjury. You should fill out this questionnaire by yourself without consulting any other person. If you wish to make further comments regarding any of your answers, please use the back of the page to do so. Remember to indicate the number of the question you are answering.

If you do not understand a question, please write, "I DO NOT UNDERSTAND", and the question will be explained to you in Court. PLEASE REALIZE THERE ARE NO RIGHT OR WRONG ANSWERS -- JUST HONEST ONES.

You are instructed not to seek out, read or research about the Defendant in this case. Specifically, you must not do any research using any internet search engine (e.g., Google, Yahoo!, Bing, etc.), message boards, chat rooms, blogs, social media (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, Google+, Foursquare, etc.). Do not read any articles in the newspaper or online, and do not listen to any news reports on the radio or on television.

If any juror does such research, this would be jury misconduct, all of our time and effort will be wasted and it will be necessary to start this process all over. Furthermore, if a juror violates this Order from the Court, the juror will be subjected to Contempt of Court charges, punishable by a fine and/or jail time.
