

PURL SCOUT SASH

PATTERN OVERVIEW

Need a way to display all of those Purl Scout badges you've earned?

Now you can knit your own Purl Scout sash!

SIZE This pattern is written for one size but can easily be

adjusted by knitting a shorter or longer length. See below for yardage recommendations when adjusting.

FINISHED Length: 60" / 152.4 cm MEASUREMENTS Width: 5" / 12.7 cm

SUGGESTED YARN Approximately 426 yds / 390 m / 173 g Yarn Over

Floyd's DK Merino/Nylon in the colorway August Fog

If adjusting length, estimate about 8 yards for every inch added or subtracted (as long as gauge has been


obtained)

SUGGESTED Four US 7/4.5 mm double pointed needles

NEEDLES (or size needed to obtain gauge)

NOTIONS Stitch marker, tapestry needle

GAUGE 4'' = 25 sts / 31 rows in stockinette



NOTES

CONSTRUCTION

This sash is knit in the round as a long closed tube with tapered ends. Once knitting is complete, the angled ends of the tube are sewn together to create a closed loop.

SIZING

This sash can easily be adjusted to fit any size! To get an idea of what length is best for you, I recommend measuring from the top of your shoulder to your opposite hip. Double this number to get the length for the main body of the sash.

Then add 14"/35.5cm to account for the angled ends.

This will give you a ballpark length to aim for, but it's definitely best to check your sizing as you go by trying it on!

CO	O
('()	Cast on
CO	Cast On

dpn Double pointed needles

EOR End of round

K Knit

K2tog Knit two stitches together

M1L Make one left
M1R Make one right
PM Place marker
SSK Slip, slip, knit
st(s) Stitch(es)



PATTERN

Using dpn as straight needles to start, CO 4.

Setup

Knitting straight...

Setup row 1 (WS): Purl to end. Setup row 2 (RS): K1, M1R, K2, M1L, K1. 6 sts.

Distribute sts across 3 dpn. Join round and PM. The remainder of the pattern will be knit in the round.

Sash Increases

Increase round 1: Knit.

Increase round 2: K1, M1R, K until 1 st

before EOR, M1L, K1.

Repeat rounds 1-2 until you have 60 sts or your desired width.

Sash Body

Knit until piece measures 53" / 134.6cm or 7"/ 17.75cm less than your desired length.

At this point, turn the tube inside out and weave in any loose ends before moving on to decreases. Turn the sash right side out when finished weaving ends.

Sash Decreases

Decrease round 1: K1, SSK, K until 3 sts before EOR, K2tog, K1.

Decrease round 2: Knit to end.

Repeat Decrease Rounds 1-2 until 6 sts remain.

Final round: K2tog to end.

Finishing

Cut 24" / 61 cm tail and thread through remaining 3 sts using a tapestry needle.

Fold the sash in half and use the tail to stitch together beveled edges. Weave in the final loose end on the inner side of the sash.

Attach Purl Scout badges and enjoy!
