A masterful calligrapher, Hermann Zapf considered himself to be, primarily, a book designer. To aid his work in that field he designed dozens of typefaces-and became the greatest type designer of the twentieth century. His many typefaces include Optima (which you are reading at present in 10-point), Palatino (which is likely found on your computer), his Marconi (the first face to be designed specifically for digital typesetting), and (based on his very own calligraphy)

Hermann Zapf also designed twelve postage stamps.
