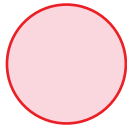
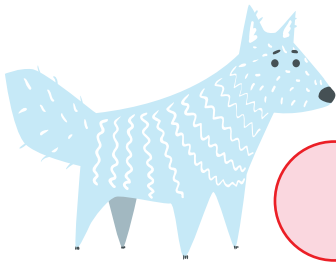


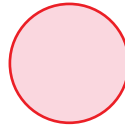
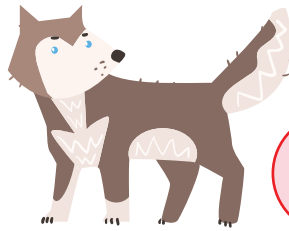
# HOT OR COLD?

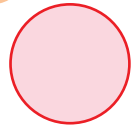
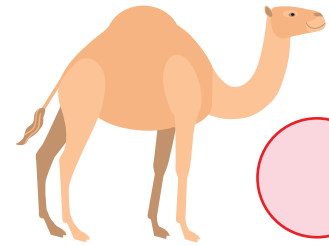
## 1. Arctic Fox

Also known as the polar or snow fox. This animal is native to the Northern Hemisphere, and is best known for its thick, warm fur.



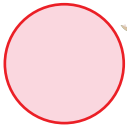
## 2. Husky

This animal can be found in the desert. They have three eyelids and two rows of eyelashes to prevent sand entering their eyes.



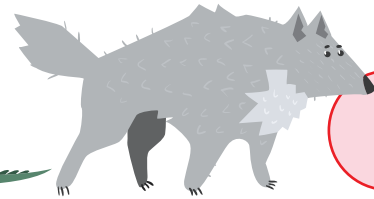
## 4. Meerkat

These animals can be found in the deserts and grasslands of the southern tip of Africa. Their fur is very thin, and they don't drink water!



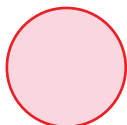
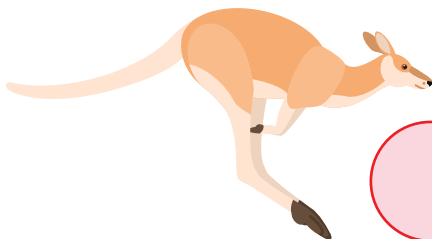
## 5. Crocodile

The crocodile will lie out in the sun to warm up. They are cold-blooded and cannot generate their own heat.



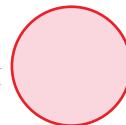
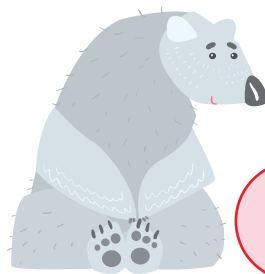
## 6. Wolf

Native to the wilderness of Eurasia and North America, its hair can grow up to four inches long. This protects it from wind, rain and snow.



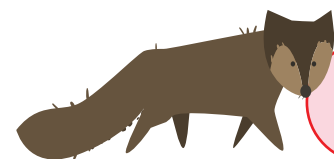
## 7. Kangaroo
