

What's the Weather Today?





Before Reading:

- Look at the front cover and read the title together.
- Get the children to describe the image.
- Help the children with vocabulary to assist with language development.
- Ask the children to suggest what is going to be discussed in the story.

Reading and Responding:

- While looking through, discuss what is happening on each page.
- Ask the children to describe the different types of weather patterns and features they see.

After Reading:

Ask the class questions related to the topic, for example:

- Which images show 'good' weather versus 'bad' weather.
- Can you point out which image shows a tornado, rainbow, snowman etc.....
- Which weather image do you like the look of or not like the look of, and why?

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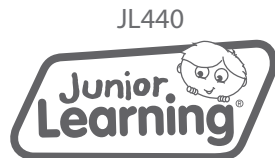
