It's the time of year when many teachers like to begin teaching recorders. Students are always really excited when they get their recorders. Keeping the students excited about learning to play an instrument can be more of a challenge. Some teachers only have their students for 30 minutes each week. It's nearly impossible to teach an instrument well in a 30 minute group lesson unless your students will practice at home. So --- how do you encourage your students to practice? And how do you ensure that they are practicing well?

Accompaniment CDs: Students who practice with an accompaniment CD practice more, and practice more effectively than students who use only the music. Playing with an accompaniment keeps the students more focussed and on-task. Our Recorder Resource Student Book 1 and 2 with CD are only \$6. **Practice Cards or Bugs:** Dated practice charts can be a motivator for the students, but they create extra work for the teacher to keep track of. Practice Bugs are much easier to keep track of and are fun for students to complete. ## **Recorder Karate:**

An incentive program that has really helped to motivate students involves giving students belts, like karate belts, colored stickers, or swimming badges, for each level that they have mastered. Choose 4-7 songs from your recorder program that represent easy-difficult levels of difficulty. Use the following songs in the Complete Recorder Resource Kit Level 1:

White belt	Song #8,	Hot Cross Buns (theme or variation)
Yellow belt	Song #17,	Skin and Bones
Blue belt	Song # 24,	Hush Little Baby
Green belt	Song # 29	Ode to Joy
Black belt	Song #35	Jingle Bells

**Extra Music:** Some students are really motivated by having more challenging music to practice than the majority of the students are able to play. Order solo recorder books and keep them in the school library for students to sign out just like a regular library book. Offer students packages of music to learn. If you can find sources of reproducible recorder music, it's easy to assemble packages of music that students can have as "challenge" materials.
