Setting: The Best Gift Ever is set in the Buymore Shopping Mall. Hang a sign at the entrance to your gym/theater with the name: "Buymore Shopping Mall" Create storefronts decorated for Christmas inside the gym. Use store names that you have where you live. The mall administration office is on stage right in front of the curtains. A desk and a sign indicates that this is the mall office.

The scene opens with Mr. Sellmore, Mr. Buymore and Miss Perky entering the mall administration office and having a business discussion.

Mr. Sellmore: (pointing to his business statement) Look at these figures! It's already September 15 and our Christmas Sales are looking glum.

Mr. Buymore: The Buymore Shopping Center takes pride in being the Mall with the MOST! We always have the best Christmas sales in town. Come now Mr. Sellmore - surely we can come up with a marketing campaign that will bring the shoppers in.

Miss Perky: Let's have a contest! Shoppers LOVE contests!

Mr. Sellmore: Miss Perky - you're brilliant! ....uh...what kind of contest?

Miss Perky: Let's have a Christmas gift contest - have the shoppers tell us....in 50 words or less....what the best Christmas gift is. I'll judge the entries, and the best entry wins the gift that they want!

Mr. Sellmore: Little ones can enter by visiting our Shopping Mall Santa.

Mr. Buymore: Stupendous idea Miss Perky! Start advertising right away!

Curtain opens onto shoppers. Everyone on stage holds shopping bags & boxes, some gift wrapped. Some shoppers can enter through the audience. The shopping mall Santa is seated in the center of the stage. The charity bell ringer stands on Stage left. Mr. Sellmore, Mr. Buymore and Miss Perky exit through the stage.

## **Costume Suggestions:**

Mr. Sellmore and Mr. Buymore: business suits

Miss Perky: horn rimmed glasses, hair in a bun, a prim blouse and skirt, carries a clipboard

Bell Ringer: ordinary clothes, carries sleigh bells and has a donation barrel

**Shoppers:** Shoppers wear ordinary clothes. Some may carry shopping bags or gifts.

**Kindergarten:** Concert clothes **Grade 1:** Pajamas and slippers

**Grade 2:** Concert Clothes

**Grade 3:** If you choose to use soloists, they should dress like the Spice Girls. The rest of the Grade 3 class wears concert clothes.

**Grade 4:** Rappers can wear backwards ball caps, black t-shirts and jeans. Dress a few children up like gifts. Cover cardboard boxes with gift wrap, cut holes for the head and arms and wear them on stage. If you have 'body sacks' they could be worn as gift bags. Attach a gift tag and wear a bow on top of the head. If you wish to, you could gift wrap the entire class.

**Grade 5:** Blues Brothers wear sunglasses, suit jackets or trench coats. If you can get a class set of felt hats it will complete the effect.

**Grade 6:** Shoppers wear ordinary clothes. Some may carry shopping bags or gifts.

## **Choreography Suggestions:**

#### 1. Greatest Gift of All

Open the curtains to a stage full of shoppers, carrying shopping bags and gifts. You can have everyone on stage sing the entire song, or you can have optional small groups sing each verse. If you choose to have the small groups sing the verses, have them pull the gift out of the shopping bag and show each other while they sing.

#### 2. New Teeth for Christmas

Specific actions are given for this song. They are noted in detail in the piano/vocal sheet music.

#### 3. Love My Slippers

The slow opening of this song could be a solo. The soloist could hold a gift wrapped box containing a pair of slippers, and put them on at the end of the solo. The rest of the class could stand with backs to the audience during the solo, and turn as they begin singing. During the chorus, the class can turn left and right, lifting the toes of their slippers left and right. A soft shoe shuffle will also look cute in this section. During the slipper pokey section the class should do the actions for the hokey pokey.

#### 4. Rocks for Christmas

There are only a few specific actions suggested for this song. Instead, use props for dramatic effect. The props needed are a broken crystal dish, a goldfish, an empty cake plate, a couple loaded water guns, a can of sardines, and a class set of gummy worms. Have a child hold up each prop as they sing about them in the song. On the line 'someone got the neighbor wet, with my water gun' have a couple of children squirt the audience.

#### 5. Christmas Spice

If you choose to use soloists, they should dress and move like the Spice Girls. Each soloist should stride forward to sing their solo, and back up again when the solo is over. During the chorus, use the same actions that the Spice Girls use in the video for the song 'Stop'.
