





How Music is Written

The Staff: Music is written on a 5 line staff. The lines and spaces are numbered from the bottom to the top. At the beginning of a staff, a clef is given. The *treble clef* circles the note G, and is used for treble, or higher notes. Practice drawing notes on lines and in spaces on the staff below.



Hill Hill has higher and lower notes. Show how the notes go by putting your hands up for the high notes and down for the low notes. The high note is called so (s) and the low note mi (m). This way of naming notes is called solfa. Review *Engine Engine*. Can you sing it in solfa?
