

- Roaring 20s: The 1920s were a prosperous (lots of money), fun-loving time in American history. It lasted from 1920 until the stock market crash of 1929 and the beginning of widespread poverty (little money) called the Great Depression.

Dixieland STUDENT READING




Dixieland was the first style of jazz. Created by African-Americans living in New Orleans about 1900, Dixieland was most popular during the 1920s ("Roaring 20s") when this fun, energetic music was performed in many nightclubs.

The invention of the drum set allowed one musician using both hands and both feet to play the snare, bass and tom-tom drums plus the cymbals all at the same time. The drummer played a swing rhythm on the cymbals.
