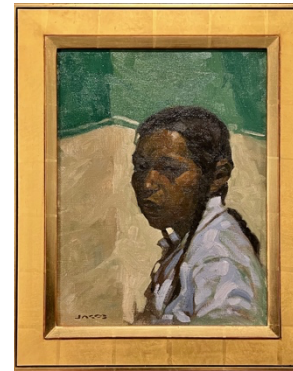

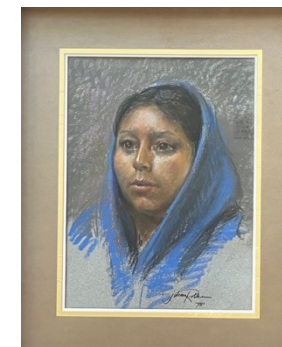

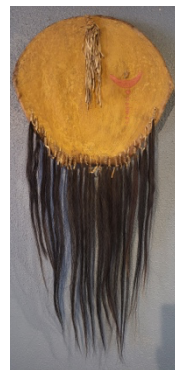

- 4) Payment may be made following the conclusion of the live auction on August 5th by credit card, check or cash. Limited storage of items can be arranged by contacting the museum.
