Effects of this medicine	
This medicine is a combination preparation comprised of a synthetic corticosteroid that supp	presses inflammation and
an antibiotic having antibacterial actions. It improves the symptoms such as itch, redness and swelling in skin.	
It is usually used for the treatment of eczema, dermatitis, psoriasis, etc. that are accompanied or may be	
accompanied by bacterial infections. As a general rule, it should not be used for inflammatic	
with fungi etc. Furthermore, it should not be used for skin ulcers, serious burns or frostbites, because the medicine	
may delay the healing process.	
Before using this medicine, be sure to tell your doctor and pharmacist	
• If you have previously experienced any allergic reactions (itch, rash, etc.) to any medicines.	
•If you are a patient with skin infections by fungi etc., abnormalities of the eardrum, skin ulcers, burns or frostbites.	
• If you are pregnant or breastfeeding.	
• If you are taking any other medicinal products. (Some medicines may interact to enhance of	or diminish medicinal
effects. Beware of over-the-counter medicines and dietary supplements as well as other prescription medicines.)

•Pay special attention when applying the medicine to where a diaper touches, and follow the instructions for use.	
• If you miss a dose, use it as soon as you remember. If it is close to your next dose, skip the missed dose.	
• If you accidentally use more than your prescribed dose, consult with your doctor or pharmacist.	
•Do not stop using the medicine unless your doctor instructs you to do so.

subcapsular cataract]

•Keep the medicine out of the reach of infants and children. Store it at room temperature (1 to 30 degrees Celsius)	
away from light and moisture.
