Effects of this medicine

This medicine suppresses the increase of viruses by inhibiting virus DNA replication.

It is usually used to treat herpes simplex.

The following patients may need to be careful when using this medicine. Be sure to tell your doctor and pharmacist.

- If you have previously experienced any allergic reactions (itch, rash, etc.) to any medicines or foods.
- ·If you are pregnant or breastfeeding.
- •If you are taking any other medicinal products. (Some medicines may interact to enhance or diminish medicinal effects. Beware of over-the-counter medicines and dietary supplements as well as other prescription medicines.)

Dosing schedule (How to take this medicine)

- In general, apply an appropriate amount of this medicine several times a day. Strictly follow the instructions.
- •Pay attention so that this medicine does not get in your eyes.
- •When using this medicine for genital herpes, pay attention not to apply this medicine to mucosal areas such as inside the vagina. You may experience feeling of stimulation.
- •If you miss a dose, apply the missed dose as soon as possible. However, if it is almost time for the next dose, skip the missed dose and then apply the next dose as instructed.
- If you accidentally apply more than your prescribed dose, consult with your doctor or pharmacist.
- •Do not stop using this medicine unless your doctor instructs you to do so.

Precautions while taking this medicine

• This medicine may degrade or damage contraceptive products made of latex rubber, such as condoms. Avoid contact with such products.

Possible adverse reactions to this medicine

The most commonly reported adverse reactions include feeling of stimulation, contact dermatitis, itch and erythematous rash. If any of these symptoms occur, consult with your doctor or pharmacist.

The symptoms described below are rarely seen as initial symptoms of the adverse reactions indicated in brackets. If any of these symptoms occur, stop taking this medicine and see your doctor immediately.

The above symptoms do not describe all the adverse reactions to this medicine. Consult with your doctor or pharmacist if you notice any symptoms of concern other than those listed above.

Storage conditions and other information

- •Keep out of reach of children. Store away from direct sunlight, heat and moisture. Do not store in a cold place at temperatures under 15 degrees Celsius.
- •Discard the remainder. Do not store them. If you do not know how to discard, seek advice of your pharmacy or medical institution. Do not give the unused medicines to others.
