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Thank you for purchasing Bible ABC Pocket Games from A Journey Through Learning. We hope that you and your child have a great time using these pocket folders for your learning time.

There is a pocket for each letter of the alphabet. Cut out, assemble and glue the pockets into the folders. Use the key to glue the pockets in the correct place. As you go, you will notice storage pockets that are also to be cut, assembled and glued at this time too.

The letter on top of each pocket is done in a special font that makes the letter traceable. Let your child do the tracings at any time.

Now is the time to get your picture cards ready. There a e tw, colorful, exciting picture cards for each letter of the alphabet. Cut the se ut. Ha e your child say the picture that is on the card aloud. Then he sy ur nil determine its beginning sound. Have your child place the ard $n$ the pocket that has the correct letter for the beginning sound. For insta ce-lf the picture begins with the B sound, then the picture card is placed in the B pocket and so forth.

We have provided convenient storag ounets to keep your cards in so they will not get lost or misplaced! Put ths pic re cards that start with the letters A-G in the pocket that is labeled Pictare Cards Storage Pocket A-G. Continue like this for the rest of your cards.

We have also include a olsul, cute cards with both the upper and lower case letters of the alrimbet. (i) ese cards are to be used to teach matching upper and lower case let erc ${ }^{2}$ ey can also be used to put the alphabet letters in the correct order across he living room floor! We have also provided a storage pocket for the upper case letters and the lower case letters so that they, too, will not get lost or misplaced..

We recommend laminating your cards to make them sturdier and to last longer.

## How to fold and connect the folders for your lapbook.



1. Gather the number of folders required for your particular lapbook.

2. Fold the left hand-side over just to the crease but not overlapping it. Your folder noy has two flaps. We like to run a ruler down each fold o make the fold neater and $\mathrm{fl}{ }^{+t-}$.Do steps 3 and 4 to the remaini folders.

3. Do steps 5 and 6 to your remaining folders (if any).

4. The patterns for all the mini-booklets are provided. Just cut out, construct, and glue them into your lapbook. Refer to the color-coded placement page or the actual mini-booklet page for placement of each mini-booklet.

The following pictures are to be put into the letter pockets according to beginning sound. Many of these pictures can have more than one name. For instance, the picture of the nest could also be called a bird nest. To avoid confusion, we have included a list of the pictures names and the letter they correspond with.

A-angel, ant B-ball, bird C-cat, cake
D-dog, duck E-elephant, eagle F-fish, fan
G-goat, goose H -hammer, I-ice cream, aleo J-jellyfish, jac K-kangr roo kite L-ladyus remon M-n Ouse, monkey N-n st, needle octopus, ocean P-pig, pumpkin Q-quilt, quarter
R-rooster, robot
S-sun, sailboat
T-tooth, turtle U-umbrella, unicorn
V-violin, volcano
W-watermelon, watch
X-x-ray, xylophone
Y-yarn, yo-yo
Z-zebra, zipper

Say the picture on the card. Think about the sound it begins with. Put the card in the correct letter pocket. When not in use, keep them in the correct storage pocket as explained in the instructions at the beginning of the book.



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
