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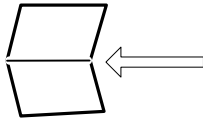
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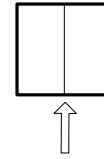

Things to Know

Hamburger Fold-Fold horizontally



Hotdog Fold-Fold vertically

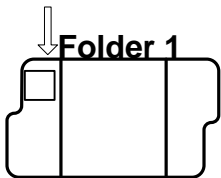


Dotted Lines-These are the cutting lines.

Accordion Fold-This fold is like making a paper fan. Fold on the first line so that title is on top. Turn over and fold on next line so that title is on top again. Turn over again and fold again on the next line so that title is on top. Continue until all folds are done.

Cover Labels-Most of the booklets that are folded look nicer with a label on top instead of just a blank space. They will be referred to as “cover label.”

How do I know where to place each template in the folder?



This placement key tells you the template goes in the first folder at the top of the left flap.

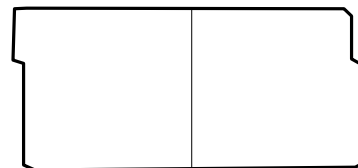
Folding a Lapbook Base

Gather the number of folders required for the project. Fold them flat as seen here.

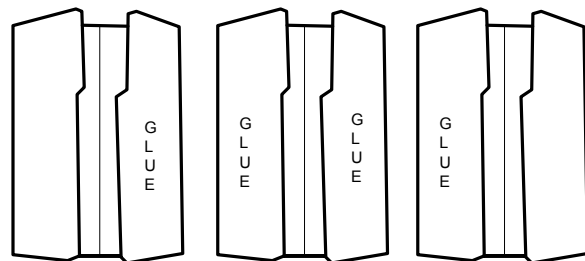
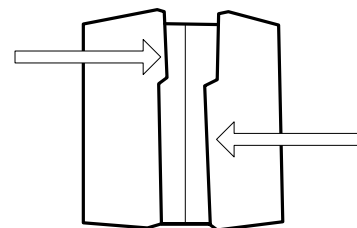
For each folder, fold the left and right sides inward toward the original line to create two flaps. Crease so that the highest part of each flap is touching the original line. It is important not to let the two flaps overlap. *You may want to take a ruler and run it down each crease to make it sharper.*

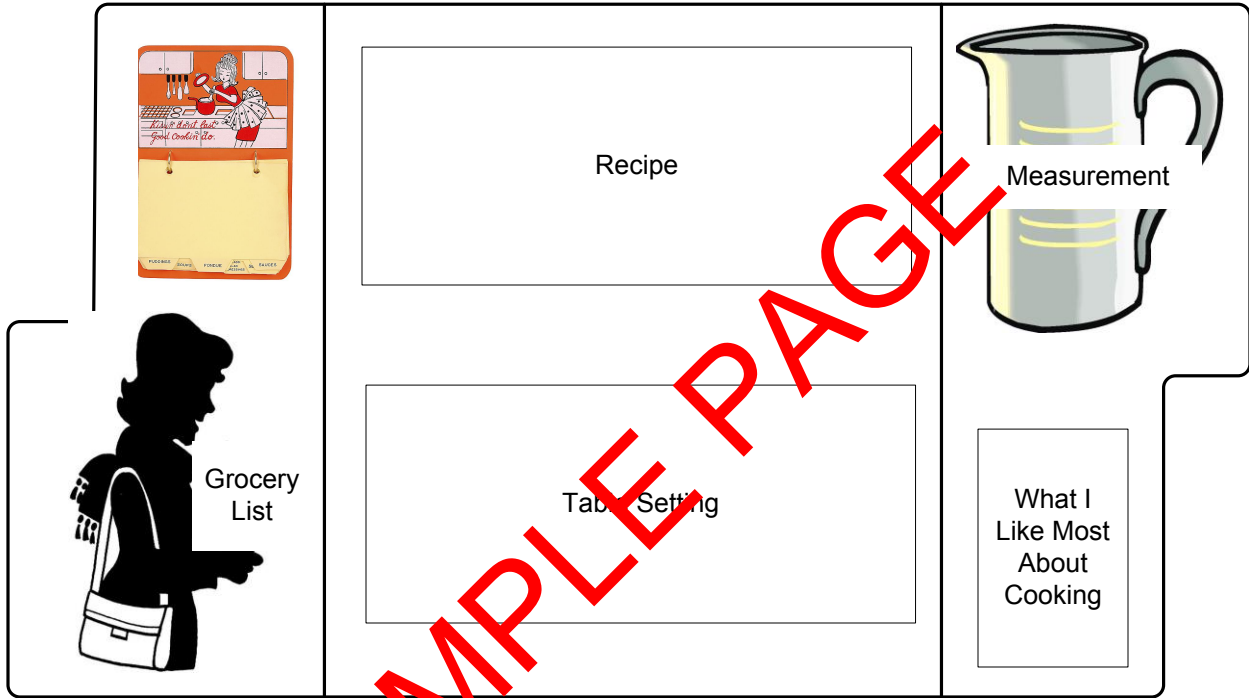
Glue your folders together by putting glue (or you may staple) on the inside of the flaps. Then press the newly glued flaps together with your hands until they get a good strong hold to each other. Follow this step to add as many folders as you need for your project. Most of our lapbooks have either 2 or 3 folders.

Highest part of flap.



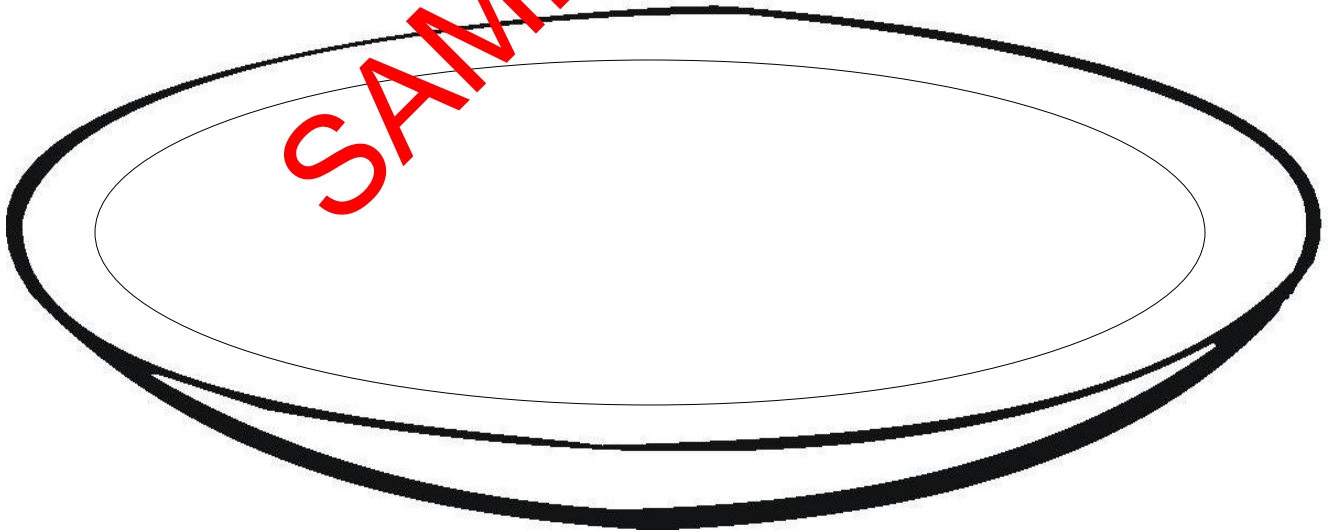


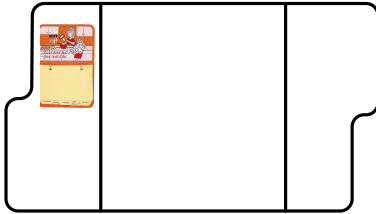
Complete the Scene

Cut on dotted line. Glue to the front of your folder. In the plate, draw the meal that you will be cooking.

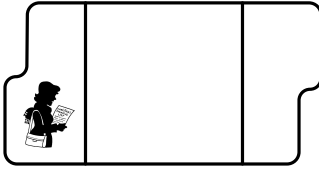


Fold your paper in half. Cut around the booklet. DO NOT CUT ON FOLD. Glue into lapbook.

Directions: Inside the booklet, write the meal that you will be cooking.

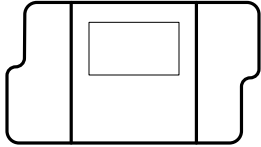
Cut out the booklet. Cut out each list. Stack them on top of each other. Staple on the line provided.

Directions: On the lists, write down the grocery items you will need to make your meal.



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

If you need more than 2 cards to write down your recipes, make a copy of this page BEFORE you cut out the booklets. Cut out the cards. Stack on top of each other. Fasten with a brad or staple. Glue into lapbook.

Directions: On each card, list the name of your recipe. Then, write it out on the card.
