## Folding a Lapbook Base

Gather the number of folders required for the project. Fold them flat as seen here.

For each folder, fold the left and right sides inward toward the original line to create two flaps. Crease so that the highest part of each flap is touching the original line. It is important not to let the two flaps overlap. You may want to take a ruler and run it down each crease to make it sharper.


Glue your folders together by purng lue (or you may staple) on the in de of 'e flaps. Then press the newaly $g$ le flaps together with your hands rint ey yet a good strong hold to each ot ar. Follow this step to add as many form as you need for your project Most ourmapbooks have either 2 or 3 rolders.

## Division Games Instructions

This lapbook provides hands-on practice for division facts through 144 $\div 12$ using a pirate theme.

## Parts of the lapbook:

1. Fact Cards are the cards that contain all of the division facts Once these are cut out, just keep them stored in your Storage Pockets until reau, 5 use.

There are two different types of pockets: -storage pockets -answer pockets.
2. Storage Pockets are named Divisible by and ane where you will keep your fact cards when not in use. Fact cards that are a. isible by the same number are considered in the same family. For exariple: $10 \div 5,15 \div 5,25 \div 5,40 \div 5$ and so forth are in the same family-the 5 family. Th esfeards go in the storage pocket that says "Divisible by 5."
3. Answer Pockets have a rita the image and a number (answer) on each. After your child figures out the siswer on a fact card, he/she slides it into the correct answer pocket.

Folder 1 contains facts divisible by 1-5
Folder 2 contains rasts divisible by 6-12
Within this laphook, you will also find a couple of coloring booklets and a definition booklet.

## Helpful Hint

Use paper clips to keep the cards together and secure inside of pockets.

Be mindful of how lapbook is handled. If turned downward or upside-down, the cards may fall out. An added safety measure would be to paper clip lapbook closed when not in use.
