## Lapbook Assembly Choices

(see photos on how to fold and glue your folders together)
Choice \#1 -Do not glue your folders together until you have completely finished all three folders. It is easier to work with one folder instead of two or three glued together.

Choice \#2 -Glue all of your folders together before beginning. Some children like to see the entire project as they work on it. It helps with keeping up with which folder you are supposed to be working in. The choices are completely up to you and your child!

## How to fold and connect the folders for your lapbook.



1. Gather the number of folders required for your particular lapbook.

2. Fold the left hand-side over just to the crease but not overlapping it. Your fromer no has two flaps. We I e to ruler down each fold to mak the fold neater and flat steps 3 and 4 to the remaining folders.

3. Do steps 5 and 6 to your remaining folders (if any).

4. Open up each folder and flatten it out.

5. Take the right side and fold it all th -vy over until the tab is the middle crease in Do not overlap this with the tab.

6. Bring the flaps together and press so they stick together.

7. The patterns for all the mini-booklets are provided. Just cut out, construct, and glue them into your lapbook. Refer to the color-coded placement page or the actual mini-booklet page for placement of each mini-booklet.

Color the continents of Asia and Europe on the map. Then cut out around the dotted lines. Glue onto front of closed lapbook.

Cut out as one piece. Fold each flap inward on the lines. Hole punch a hole on each flap (The places are marked.) Cut out the two square booklets on this page and the one on the next page. Stack all of the booklets together and staple into the center of the booklet. Fold the flaps back inward and tie closed with a piece of yarn or ribbon through the holes. Glue into lapbook.
Directions: Fill out the information on each booklet.
