
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Things to Know



Choice #1 -Do not glue your folders together until you have completely finished all three folders. It is easier to work with one folder instead of two or three glued together.

Choice #2 -Glue all of your folders together before beginning. Some children like to see the entire project as they work on it. It helps with keeping up with which folder you are supposed to be working in. The choices are completely up to you and your child!

How It All Goes Together

What you need to get started

*Trail Guide to Learning: Paths of Settlement-Volume One *The lapbook pages for Paths of Settlement-Volume One *9 colored file folders *Scissors *Glue *Hole puncher *Brads

*Stapler

To make the storage system (optional)

*Duct tape (preferably at least two different colors but not necessary) *One 3-ring binder

Can I store both volumes one & two from Paths n rtu ment together?

Yes! A Journey Through Learning has come up with a way that you can store all of your lapbooks from these books in ONE convenient location 3-ring binder serves as a great place to keep your lapbooks. This method of storage not only keeps your lapbooks from getting lost but also keeps them neat and readily vailable to show to dad, grandparents, friends, etc. When they are not being shown of, just place the binder on your bookshelf! Below are step-by-step directions of how to research storage binder.



Roll out enough an tape to go across the folders lengthwise.

Put tape sticky side up. Place bound edge of lapbook on the duct tape (no more than $\frac{1}{4}$ inch!).





Then stick duct tape to

the other side again

to hole punch.

Stick duct tape into hole puncher but be careful not to punch holes in your folders.

It will look like this.

Store folders in 3-ring binder.

How to fold and connect the folders for your lapbook.



1. Gather the number of folders required for your particular lapbook.



2. Open up each folder and flatten it out.



3. Take the right side and fold it all the way over until the tab is just before the middle crease in the fuder. Do not overlap this crease with the tab.



4. Fold the left hand-side over just to the crease but not overlapping it. Your folder new has two flaps. We like to run a ruler down each fold to make the fold neater and finiter. D steps 3 and 4 to the remaining folders.



7. Do steps 5 and 6 to your remaining folders (if any).



5 Take to of the folders and apply a generous amount of glue to their flaps. We recommend using Zip Dry Paper Glue.




6. Bring the flaps together and press so they stick together.




8. The patterns for all the mini-booklets are provided. Just cut out, construct, and glue them into your lapbook. Refer to the color-coded placement page or the actual mini-booklet page for placement of each mini-booklet.


Complete the Scene




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
Lesson 1 Parts 1E & 1F pages 2-4




Cut out each piece. Stack them on top of each other according to length with title page on front. Staple at the top. Glue into lapbook. **E-History:** Answer the questions on each booklet. **F-States:** Complete the map.



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




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


Lesson 1 Parts 3E & 3F pages 12-14



Cut out the 4 pieces. Stack them together so that the tabs are in order and cover page is on top. Staple together down the left hand side. Glue into lapbook. E-History: Fill out the information on each booklet. F-States: Complete the map.





Cut out the two booklets on this page and the one booklet on the next. Stack on top of each other with the cover sheet on top. Attach together with a brad or a piece of ribbon. Glue into lapbook. **E-Science:** Define the words on the next two booklets.
