

He/She will use narration skills, writing skills, organizational skills and even artistic skills. It also allows you to know how much your child has understood and gained from the subject.

How do I use these notebooking pages with the TruthQuest History program?


You will find a notebooking page for most of the topics in the program. Simply read about the topic of study, then have your child "re-tell" what they have learned on the page.
