Things to Know Our lapbook templates are color coded to aid in understanding and assembly. The red box is where the TITLE of the booklet is written. The blue box is where the TOPICS or QUESTIONS of the booklet are written. See example below.

The red box means the title of the booklet is written here.

Hotdog fold

This is inside the books. The bije boxes mean your topics or questions are writt where. Then in the blank space, write about the topics.

Hamburger Fold-Fold short-ways or cross

Hotdog Fold- Fold long-vals or down

Dotted Lines These are the cutting lines

How to fold and connect the folders for your lapbook.



1. Gather the number of folders required for your particular lapbook



2. Open up each folder and flatten it out.



3. Take the right side and fold it all the my over until the tab is just lefter the middle crease in the fold. Do not overlap this crease with the tab.



4. Fold the left hand side over just to the crease but not overlapping it. Your folder now has two flaps. We like to make the fold neater and flatter of steps 3 and 4 to the remaining folders.



5. Take two of the folders and pply a generous amount of glue to heir flaps.



6. Bring the flaps together and press so they stick together.




7. Do steps 5 and 6 to your remaining folders (if any).




8. We provide the patterns for all the minibooklets. Just cut out, construct and glue them into your lapbook. Refer to the color-coded placement page or the actual mini-booklet page for placement of each mini-booklet.


Cut out as one piece. Hamburger fold on middle line. Put title in the red box. Glue into lapbook. Inside booklet, write about topic.




Cut out as one piece. Hamburger fold in half. Put title in red box. Glue into lapbook. Write about topic inside booklet.




Cut out the booklet as one piece. Fold in half. This booklet can be placed vertically or horizontally. Put title in red box. Glue into lapbook. Write about topic inside of box.




Cut out large square. Hamburger fold on middle line. Put title in red box. Glue into lapbook. Cut out the 3 small matchbook booklets from next page. Write topics in blue boxes. Hamburger fold them on middle line and then fold tab up and over to keep booklet closed. Glue all 3 matchbooks inside of large booklet. Write about topics inside each matchbook.



Cut out as one booklet. Fold over flap and then fold the other down. Put title in red box. Cut out the labels and put topics on them. Glue onto blank sides of booklet. Glue booklet into lapbook. Write in answers to your topics.




Cut out the booklet as one piece. Glue into lapbook. Put title inside of the red box. Write about topic on the lines.




Copywork


Write a short bit of text or poem in the red box for student to copy on lines. Cut out the booklet and glue into lapbook. Student may draw a picture at the bottom.




Cut out both pieces. Hamburger fold smaller booklet in the middle and glue into white space at top of bigger piece. Put title in red box. Now glue big piece into lapbook. Inside the smaller booklet, draw a picture about topic. On the lines, write about topic.




Cut out the two squares on this page and the square on the next page. Stack with title page on top and staple together at the top. Put title in red box. Glue into lap book. Write about topic on the lines.






Cut out the booklet as one piece. Hamburger fold in half. Cut on the dotted lines to form three flaps. Put topics in blue boxes. Glue into lapbook. Under each flap, write about topics.



*Same as previous page except has 4 flaps

Cut out the booklet as one piece. Hamburger fold in half. Cut on the dotted lines to form four flaps. Put topics on blue boxes . Glue into lapbook. Under each flap, write about topics.



Cut out the two big pieces. Cut out the "window" and put title on front in box. Cut out the separate rectangles and draw pictures on them. Glue in the correct order inside the booklet. (This booklet works well for showing something in stages, like the growth from eggs, to tadpoles, to a frog.) Stack both big pieces on top of each other and fasten with a brad so top piece can rotate around. Glue into lapbook.
