
A lapbook is to be a fun project, not stressful.

Hamburger Fold-Fold horizontally Hotdog Fold-Fold vertically

Dotted Lines-These are the cutting lines.

Accordion Fold-This fold is like making a paper fan. Fold on the first the so that title is on top. Turn over and fold on next line so that title is on top again. Turn over again and fold again on the next line so that title is on top. Continue until all folds are done.

Cover Labels-Most of the booklets that are folded look kicer with a label on top instead of just a blank space. They will be referred to as "cover label."







How to fold your older



Fold the left and right sides inward toward the original line to create two flaps. Crease so that the highest part of each flap is touching the original line. It is important not to let the two flaps overlap. You may want to take a ruler and run it down each crease to make it sharper.

The front of lapbook







Hamburger fold booklet in half on the middle line. Glue into folder.


Directions: What is the purpose of president? Write it inside the booklet.






Fold paper on line. Cut out around shape but do not cut fold. Glue booklet into lapbook.

Directions: Write the date of George Washington's birth inside the booklet.

Fold paper in half on the line in middle. Cut out around picture but do not cut fold. Glue booklet into folder. **Directions:** What have you learned about Mt. Vernon? Write it inside the booklet.





Cut out each piece. Stack pieces on top of each other according to length with title page on front and staple at the top. Glue into lapbook.


Directions: Write the quote in your best handwriting.






Quote in my Best Handwriting
