What is a Parable?

When Jesus was on earth long ago in Palestine, he told many stories. In the Holy Bible, these stories are called parables.

Jesus' parables have a double meaning. First, there is the literal meaning, apparent to anyone who has experience with the subject matter. However, beyond the literal meaning lies a deeper meaning -- a beneath the surface lesson about God's truth and his kingdom.


When reading the parables, it is important not to be bogged down in the details of the story. The main point is what counts. Each parable will typically present a single point.


