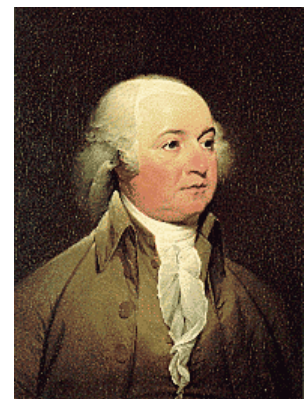
At his inauguration, George Washington had only one tooth! When he did wear dentures, they were made from a combination of animal bone, lead, and ivory. He did not have wooden teeth.

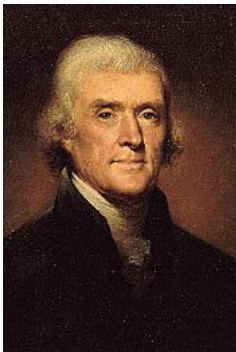
After the British imposed the tax on tea that led to the Boston Tea Party, John Adams would drink only coffee.
