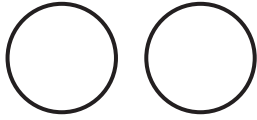


# PATTERN OWL ART

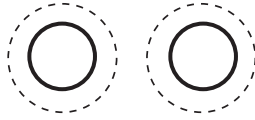
Materials needed: Paper, pencil, eraser and crayons, markers or colored pencils

1



Draw TWO circles.

2



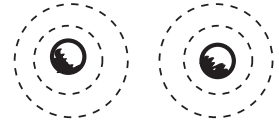
Draw TWO more circles inside the first ones.

3



Draw TWO more circles inside the other ones. It should look like a bullseye.

4



Shade in 1/2 of the center of the eye.

5



Make a curved line pointing down (like a sideways smile).

6



Then attach a curved line on the right side.

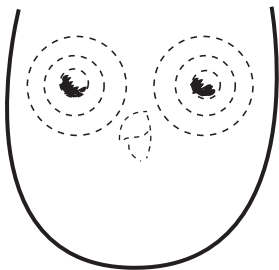
Then add a curved line in the middle.

8



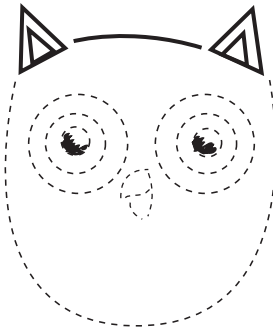
Then finally a curved for the bottom of the beak. Then add his nostril.

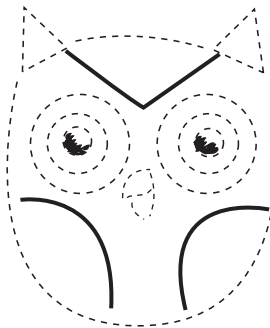
Draw a U shaped Body. Make sure to leave enough space in the belly for the wings and patterns.

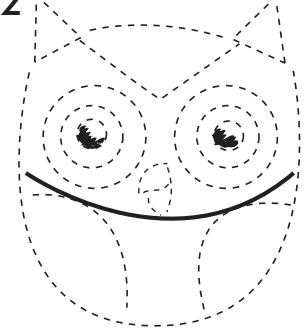
Add TWO triangles at the top for ears with TWO triangles inside. Then add a curved line to connect the top of the head.

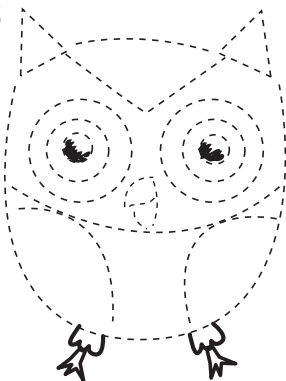
Now let's separate our OWL- add a V shape above the eyes. Then TWO curves for the wings.

One More! Add a line above or between the wings.

Don't forget the legs and feet!

**FINALLY...**



Add patterns to each section. Whatever you'd like, it's totally up to you. You can go as BIG as you want or as detailed as you'd like. For younger children, you can use this as a shape lesson and pick one for each section.

You can mirror what you do on one side or keep them different, it's up to you.

When you're all done, it's time to color it in!
