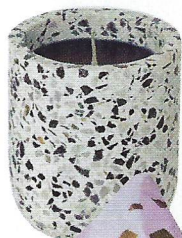

← TOTAL TERRAZZO

With sustainability a design buzzword, the material of the moment is terrazzo, a colourful spin on concrete. 'With a significant interest in recycling and upcycling, many newer materials are proudly showing that they are made from "second-hand" plastic, showing lots of large flecks of colour, such as scaled up terrazzo,' says Laure Grezard, senior designer at made.com. As well as monochrome pieces, at Habitat they've also taken inspiration from the 1970s Miami movement for a cheery vibe. The look has also been used in soft furnishings for a shot of colour.

Don't waste blankets on your bed – hang them up instead. 'We're embracing textiles as well as hanging other artefacts on our walls to adorn them, which I think is influenced by the move towards craft and away from mass produced,' says Ella Jones, the interior designer behind boutique store A New Tribe. 'Hanging textiles as art adds a softness and tactility to a space. Hanging them against a contrasting colour makes them stand out. Either tack them directly onto the wall, or use a nice pole and hooks for a more draped effect. They look great framed too for extra impact.'

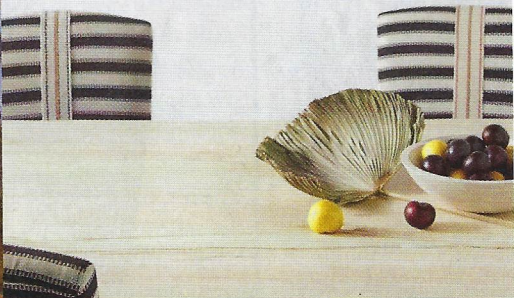

Mark this date in your diary now – 1 May is when IKEA's eagerly awaited rug collaboration with eight contemporary artists goes live. The limited-edition rugs of the Art Collection – priced at £400 each – are all handmade and make a statement. The rug by Virgil Abloh – founder of fashion brand Off-White and Louis Vuitton Menswear artistic director – features the words 'Keep Off' and sold out at a pop-up shop in Paris last year. Other artists include Misaki Kawai, whose rug features different pile lengths so you can cuddle the cats, and Craig Green, whose design has parrots. Meanwhile, John Lewis has teamed up with rug maker Luke Irwin for a collection, available from April. ▶

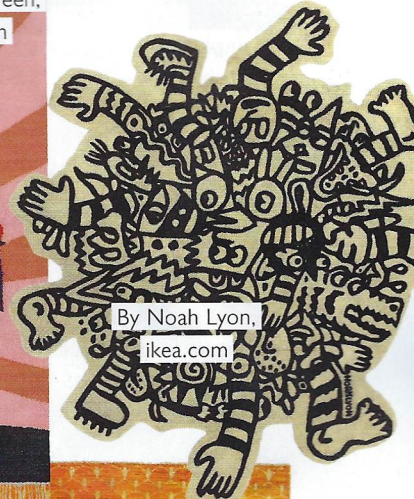

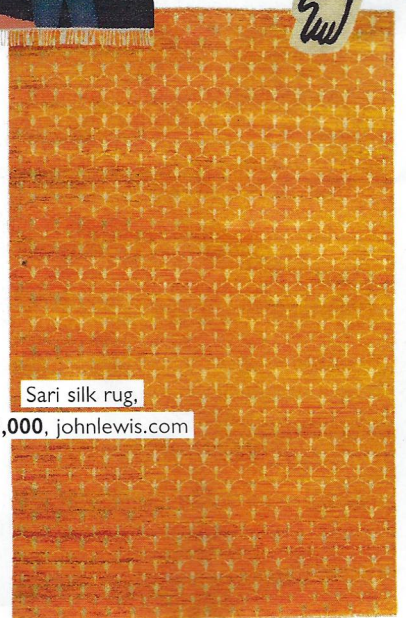
