



Pattern Collection: Accessories

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width: 23" (measured on the bias)

Length: 98"

MATERIALS

Fibra Natura Flax Lace (100% linen; 547 yds/100g)

- 110 Black (A) – 2 hanks
- 108 White (B) – 2 hanks

Needle: US Size 4 (3.5 mm) straight or size needed to obtain gauge

Notions: Tapestry needle, blocking wires

GAUGE

20 sts x 28 rows = 4" in stockinette stitch

Save time, check your gauge.

Knit, Relax, Smile, Repeat!

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PATTERN NOTES

This generously sized scarf is very lightweight. It is knit on the bias – a decrease is worked at the beginning of every right side row and an increase is worked at the end of every right side row which causes the slant in the fabric.

Color is changed every other row. Carry the unused color loosely up the side of the work. Be sure to steam or wet block using blocking wires to fully open up the stitches.

SCARF

With A, cast on 140 sts. Purl a WS row.

Establish Pattern

Row 1 (RS): With B sl 1 pwise wyib, ssk, knit to last st, m1, sl 1 pwise wyib.

Row 2 (WS): With B purl.

Row 3: With A sl 1 pwise wyib, ssk, knit to last st, m1, sl 1 pwise wyib.

Row 4: With A purl.

Rep Rows 1-4 until piece meas 98", ending with WS Row 3 of patt. Bind off all sts pwise over the next WS row.

FINISHING

Weave in ends but do not trim. Run blocking wires through all 4 sides of scarf. Pull taut, pin to blocking board. Wet or steam block. Trim ends when fully dry.

Abbreviations

dec('d)	decrease(d)
inc('d)	increase(d)
k	knit
m1	insert left needle from front to back under horizontal strand of yarn lying between st just worked and next st, knit or purl this st through the back loop (1 st inc'd)
meas	measures
ndl	needle
p	purl
pwise	purlwise
rep	repeat
RS	right side
ssk	slip next 2 sts individually knitwise, slip them back to left needle in this position, knit them together through the back loops (1 st dec'd)
st(s)	stitch(es)
St st	Stockinette stitch (knit on RS rows, purl on WS rows; in the rnd, knit every rnd)
WS	wrong side
wyib	with yarn held in back



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
