FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Height: Approx. 6½" tall

MATERIALS

<u>Universal Yarn Bamboo Pop</u> (50% bamboo, 50% cotton; 100g/292 yds)

Note: Choose any of the following colors to work the Body.

- 143 Rosy (Orange Doll) 1 ball
- 145 Seashell (Pink Doll) 1 ball
- 148 Almond (Green Doll) 1 ball
- 150 Penny (Blue Doll) 1 ball
- 151 Hickory (Yellow Doll) 1 ball
- 152 Chocolate (Purple Doll) 1 ball

Hook: US Size 0 (2 mm) *or size needed to obtain gauge*

Notions: Polyester fiber filling, embroidery needle, scissors, sewing pins, removable stitch markers, 2 pipe cleaners, black crochet thread or embroidery floss



GAUGE

32 sc x 32 rnds = 4"

Save time, check your gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

Get creative and express yourself with these delightful dolls! These cuties were designed for Universal Yarn by Jacki Donhou, and they use six of our new colors of Bamboo Pop to celebrate the diversity of our skin tones. Each doll features playful hair styles and unique accessories. They're perfect as sweet décor or toys for your little one. You can try to just make one, but we're pretty sure you won't be able to resist making them all!

These dolls are created modularly with minimal seaming by first creating two Arms and setting them aside. Then the Body is made seamlessly by making one Leg, then joining a second Leg to it before working in the round for the Body. The Arms are attached while working rounds of the Body, before moving on to shoulder and neck shaping, then finally the head. Ears are made and sewn on separately. Lastly, facial features are embroidered on to finish the doll.

You will work in unjoined, continuous rounds. To track them, place a removable stitch marker in the first stitch to denote the beginning of each round. You will move the marker up each round after completing the first stitch of each new round.

This pattern uses a shorthand style of crochet instructions. Abbreviation descriptions and instructions are given in the Stitch Guide. Some examples are provided below:

- When working stitches around, instead of reading something like "sc in the next 2 sts," you will simply see "sc 2."
- When working repeats of sets of instructions in a round, instead of seeing something like "* sc in the next 2 sts, 2 scs in the next st; rep 4 more times," you will simply see "(sc 2, INC) x 5."

STITCH GUIDE

Magic Circle (MC)

Make a circle with tail of yarn behind working yarn. Reach hk inside of circle made, yo with working yarn, pull up a lp, yo, ch 1, begin patt with indicated number of sts. Once Rnd 1 is est'd, pull tail of yarn taut.

Decrease 1 sc (DEC)

Sc2tog over the next 2 sts by inserting hk into indicated st, yo, pull up lp (2 lps on hk), insert hk into next st, yo pull up lp (3 lps on hk), yo draw through all 3 lps on hk.



Increase 1 sc (INC)

2 sc in the next indicated st.

Repeat Instructions (...)

A sequence of instructions to be repeated will be given inside parenthesis.

Repeat Counts (x)

An x followed by a number indicates the total number of times to repeat the sequence in parenthesis.

PATTERN BEGINS

BASIC DOLL BODY

ARMS

Make 2 alike. Note: Do not stuff arms, wire will be added to the arms later. Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts. Rnd 2: INC x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts. Rnds 3-5: Sc in each st around. Rnd 6: Sc 4, DEC 2, sc 4 - 2 sts dec'd, 10 sts rem. Rnds 7-17: Sc in each st around. Fasten off and hide tails inside the Arms. Remove m from each Arm.

LEGS

Make 2 alike. Note: Stuff legs firmly with polyester stuffing as you go. Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts. Rnd 2: INC x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts. Rnd 3: (Sc, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts. Rnds 4-14: Sc in each st around. Fasten off first Leg and hide tails inside. Do not remove m. Do not fasten off second Leg. Continue to Body.





BODY

Note: The first ch made will count as the first st of the Body and will be worked into twice. Once the first Leg is joined, you will work into one side of the ch while completing the first rnd. You will then work into the Front side of the ch to begin the next rnd.

Note 2: To begin, hold first Leg next to second Leg so that the first st (marked with removable m) is aligned as the next st to work into after the first ch is made.

Note 3: Stuff body firmly with polyester stuffing as you go.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, place removable m in ch, sc in marked st of first Leg then remove m's from both Legs, sc 17, sc in the back of the ch, *one side of ch worked*, sc 18 around 2nd Leg – 38 sts.

Rnd 2: Sc in each st around.

Note: If there are holes visible where the two Legs are joined to the Body, use the embroidery needle and the leftover yarn to sew it closed.



Rnd 3: Sc 9, INC 2, sc 17, INC 2, sc 8 – 4 sts inc'd, 42 sts.

Rnds 4-8: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 9: (Sc 5, DEC) x 6 – 6 sts dec'd, 36 sts rem.

Rnd 10-12: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 13: (Sc 2, DEC, sc 2) x 6 – 6 sts dec'd, 30 sts rem.

Rnds 14-16: Sc in each st around.





Add Arms to Body

Note: Arms should sit parallel to the Legs. Exact st counts are given for the placement of the Arms, however if your tension has varied up till now, you may need to make an adjustment by either adding the Arms 1-2 sts before or after the indicated st counts below.

Note 2: Arms will be attached by working half of the sts at a time over 2 rnds. First, you will place the Arms with the hand-shaping facing forward. Align 5 of the Arm sts with the next 5 indicated sts of the Body, then work through both the Arm and Body sts. On the following round, you will only work into the remaining 5 Arm sts.

Note 3: Assign either arm to be Arm 1 and Arm 2.

Rnd 17: Sc 22, sc 5 *Body + Arm 1 sts*, sc 3 – 30 sts.

Rnd 18: Sc 7, sc 5 *Body + Arm 2 sts*, sc 10, sc 5 *rem Arm 1 sts*, sc 3 – 30 sts.

Rnd 19: Sc 7, sc 5 *rem Arm 2 sts* sc 18 – 30 sts.

Rnd 20: Sc in each st around.



Optional: To add structure and stability to the upper Body, take 2 pipe cleaners and twist them together to make one thick pipe cleaner. Take the two ends and twist them together to make a point. Bring the bottom center of the pipe cleaners up to the twist. This will create two long wires that you will feed down through both Arms. Push the wire down in the first Arm and then into the second Arm. This will leave the ends of the wire coming up out of the neck.

Rnd 21: (Sc 3, DEC) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 24 sts rem.



Rnd 22: (Sc, DEC, sc) x 6 – 6 sts dec'd, 18 sts rem. **Rnd 23:** (Sc, DEC) x 6 – 6 sts dec'd, 12 sts rem. **Rnds 24-25:** Sc in each st around.



Head Shaping

Rnd 26: Flo (sc, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts. **Rnd 27**: Flo (sc, INC, sc) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts. Rnd 28: (Sc 3, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 30 sts. **Rnd 29:** (Sc 2, INC, sc 2) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 36 sts. Rnd 30: (Sc 5, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 42 sts. **Rnd 31:** (Sc 3, INC, sc 3) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 48 sts. Rnd 32: (Sc 7, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 54 sts. **Rnd 33:** (Sc 4, INC, sc 4) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 60 sts. Rnds 34-41: Sc in each st around. Rnd 42: (Sc 4, DEC, sc 4) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 54 sts rem. Rnd 43: (Sc 7, DEC) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 48 sts rem. Rnd 44: Sc in each st around. Rnd 45: (Sc 3, DEC, sc 3) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 42 sts rem. Rnd 46: (Sc 5, DEC) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 36 sts rem. **Rnd 47:** (Sc 2, DEC, sc 2) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 30 sts rem. Rnd 48: (Sc 3, DEC) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 24 sts rem. Rnd 49: (Sc, DEC, sc) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 18 sts rem. Rnd 50: (Sc, DEC) x 6 - 6 sts dec'd, 12 sts rem. **Rnd 51:** (Sc, DEC) x 4 – 4 sts dec'd, 8 sts rem.

Fasten off. Use embroidery needle to weave in ends under the flo rnds and pull taut to close.



EARS *Make 2 alike.* Rnd 1: MC, hdc 9 - 9 sts. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



Attach Ears to Head

Pin the ears on the side of the Head between Rnds 33 & 37 with 31 stitches between the bottom of the Ears along the front of the Head. When pinned evenly, sew on using the leftover ends. When finished, weave ends into the Head.



FACE DETAILS

Nose

Using sewing pins, mark the width of the nose in the center of the face at Rnd 36 and 3 stitches apart. Mark the triangle eyes with the first pin three stitches away from the nose, and the second four stitches away from the first. Add the last pin one round above the two eye pins and center it. You should have two triangle-marked eyes like in the photos below. With the embroidery needle enter the yarn through the side of the Head to the first nose pin. Whip stitch a nose between the two pins 4-5 times. Once complete, exit the yarn back through the same stitch on the side of the Head, knot the two ends, and weave the ends into the Head.






Eyes

To embroider the eyes, use black crochet thread or embroidery floss, and an embroidery needle and enter on the side of the Head and exit at the first pin. Then enter the stitch at the second pin horizontally to the first one. To make the triangle shape, bring the needle up to the third pin, loop the needle around the thread, and enter through the same stitch. This circles the thread to make the shape and holds it in place. Exit the needle through the side of the Head where you entered, tie the ends, and hide them in the Head.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Varies: Finished items are made to fit a 6½" Bamboo Pop Doll Body.

MATERIALS

<u>Universal Yarn Bamboo Pop</u> (50% bamboo, 50% cotton; 100g/292 yds)

Note: The Doll Body featured in this pattern uses Universal Yarn Bamboo Pop in the color 148 Almond – 1 ball.

Dress

- 108 Lime Green (color A) 1 ball
- 117 Emerald (color B) 1 ball

Shoes

• 140 Crocodile - 1 ball

Hair

• 109 Clover - 1 ball

Hook: US Size B/1 (2.25 mm) or size needed to obtain gauge

Notions: Embroidery needle, scissors, sewing pins, removable stitch markers, sew on snaps size 4/0, sewing needle, sewing thread, clear elastic hair ties

GAUGE

28 sc x 36 rnds = 4"

Save time, check your gauge.



PATTERN NOTES

This pattern details how to make the Dress, Shoes and Hair for the doll. Each piece of clothing is created to be removable and interchangeable with other dolls and clothing. The Hair is created and sewn on to the doll head permanently.

The Skirt portion of the Dress and the Shoes will be worked in unjoined, continuous rounds. To track them, place a removable stitch marker in the first stitch to denote the beginning of each round. You will move the marker up each round after completing the first stitch of each new round.

This pattern uses a shorthand style of crochet instructions. Abbreviation descriptions and instructions are given in the Stitch Guide. Some examples are provided below:

- When working stitches around, instead of reading something like "sc in the next 2 sts," you will simply see "sc 2."
- When working repeats of sets of instructions in a round, instead of seeing something like "* sc in the next 2 sts, 2 scs in the next st; rep more 4 times," you will simply see "(sc 2, INC) x 5."

STITCH GUIDE

Magic Circle (MC)

Make a circle with tail of yarn behind working yarn. Reach hk inside of circle made, yo with working yarn, pull up a lp, yo, ch 1, begin patt with indicated number of sts. Once Rnd 1 is est'd, pull tail of yarn taut.

Decrease 1 sc (DEC)

Sc2tog over the next 2 sts by inserting hk into indicated st, yo, pull up lp (2 lps on hk), insert hk into next st, yo pull up lp (3 lps on hk), yo draw through all 3 lps on hk.

Increase 1 sc (INC)

2 sc in the next indicated st.



Repeat Instructions (...)

A sequence of instructions to be repeated will be given inside parenthesis.

Repeat Counts (x)

An x followed by a number indicates the total number of times to repeat the sequence in parenthesis.

Changing Colors

Work until 2 lps remain on hk, yo with new color and pull through the last 2 lps to complete the stitch.

PATTERN BEGINS DRESS BODY

Note: This Dress Body is worked in turning rows from bottom to top.

Begin with Dress color A.

Row 1: Ch 37, turn – 37 chs.

Row 2: Sc in 2nd ch from hk (*sk'd ch does not count as st here and throughout*), sc 35, ch 1, turn – 36 sts.

Rows 3-5: Sc 36, ch 1, turn.

Row 6: Sc 6, ch 9, sk 6, sc 12, ch 9, sk 6, sc 6, ch 1, turn – 24 sc, 18 chs; 42 total sts.

Row 7: Sc 16, DEC, sc 6, DEC, sc 16, ch 1, turn – 2 sts dec'd, 40 sts rem.

Row 8: Sc 16, DEC, sc 4, DEC, sc 16, ch 1, turn – 2 sts dec'd, 38 sts rem.

Row 9: Sc 17, (DEC) x 2, sc 17 - 2 sts dec'd, 36 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



SLEEVES

Make 2 alike.

Note: The INC's below are worked with dc sts instead of sc sts.

Turn Dress Body upside down and attach yarn to a corner of the open armhole. You will work across the 9 sts of the opening created by the 9 chs in Row 6 of Dress Body.

Row 1: (Dc, INC, dc) x 3, sl st to opposite corner of armhole - 12 sts.

Fasten off and weave in ends.





SKIRT

Note: This Dress Skirt is worked from the bottom of the Dress Body in unjoined, unturned rounds. Begin with Dress color B. Attach yarn to any bottom corner of the Dress Body and work along the bottom edge.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc 36, ch 2, sl st to 1st sc made, do not turn – 36 sc, 2 chs; 38 total sts.

Rnd 2: Sc 6, INC, sc 8, INC, sc 4, INC, sc 8, INC, sc 8, changing to Dress color A on last st. Fasten off Dress color B – 4 sts inc'd, 42 sts.

Note: the INC's below are worked with dc sts instead of sc sts.

Rnd 3: (Dc, INC) x 21 – 21 sts inc'd, 63 sts.

Rnd 4: (Dc, INC, dc) x 21 – 21 sts inc'd, 84 sts.

Rnds 5-8: Dc in each st around.

Rnd 9 (Partial Rnd): Hdc, sc, sl st - 3 sts to taper down the rnds.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

With a sewing needle and thread, sew the snap-on buttons to the opening of the Dress Body to allow you to change the dress to another one if preferred.





SHOES

Make 2 alike.
Note: These Shoes are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.
Rnd 1: MC with 9 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 9 sts.
Rnd 2: INC x 9 - 9 sts inc'd, 18 sts.
Rnd 3: Sc 1, INC, sc 5, INC x 4, sc 5, INC, sc 1 - 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.
Rnd 4: Blo sc in each st around.
Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.
Rnd 6: Sc 8, (DEC, SC) x 2, DEC, sc 8 - 3 sts dec'd, 21 sts rem.
Rnd 7: Sc 8, DEC, sc, DEC, sc 8 - 2 sts dec'd, 19 sts rem.
Fasten off and weave in ends.

GREEN HAIR

Hair Base

Note: The Hair Base is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts.

Rnd 3: (Sc, INC) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts.

Rnd 4: (Sc, INC, sc) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Do not fasten off.

Hair Strands


Note: Each Hair Strand is worked back and forth over one row count, first chaining away from the circular Hair Base, then stitching back towards it.

Note 2: Before starting each new row, sl st to the next st of Rnd 4 of Hair Base.

Rows 1-12: Ch 66, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 64 - 65 sts per Strand. 12 Strands total.

Rows 13-24: Ch 46, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 44 - 45 sts per Strand. 12 Strands total.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.







ATTACHING THE HAIR

Part 1: Start by matching up the MC of the Hair and the MC of the Head, then adding a pin to the top of the Hair to keep it in place.

Part 2: With the shortest Hair Strands centered on the face, pin the next longest Strands above each of the Ears. Pin the rest of the long Hair Strands side by side to the back of the Head to cover it. Adjust the Hair strands as needed to fill any bare spots.



Part 3: Sew the Hair Base to the Head using the embroidery needle and the long tail left over. Starting at the top of the Head, make a few whip stitches around the outside of round 4 and through the Hair and Head to keep it from moving around. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Part 4: Flip the Head upside down and sew the Hair Strands down beginning at the pins along the back Hair strands and working your way around the back of the Head. Fasten off and weave in ends.



Part 5 continues on the following page.



Part 5: Split the front 12 Hair Strands in half with a part in the middle of the forehead. Working from above the left Ear to the center of the part, twist the top of the first Hair Strand and sew it on top of the long Strand to the left of it. Then twist the top of the next Hair Strand and sew it overlaps the last Hair Strand. Try to curve the Strands just a little as you sew. Repeat these steps until there are 6 Hair Strands sewn above the Ear.

Repeat the above steps for the Hair Strands at the right Ear. Fasten off and weave in ends.



FINISHING

Use small, clear hair ties to make ponytails behind each Ear. Pull the back Hair Strands up to each Ear, add the front bangs and wrap the hair tie around the Hair Strands to create the ponytails.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Varies: Finished items are made to fit a 6½" Bamboo Pop Doll Body.

MATERIALS

<u>Universal Yarn Bamboo Pop</u> (50% bamboo, 50% cotton; 100g/292 yds)

Note: The Doll Body featured in this pattern uses Universal Yarn Bamboo Pop in the color 143 Rosy - 1 ball.

Pants

• 110 Sand - 1 ball

Suspenders

• 135 Apricot Slush - 1 ball

Shirt and Shoes

• 101 White - 1 ball

Bowtie

• 139 Sundae - 1 ball

Hair

• 129 Winter Squash - 1 ball

Hook: US Size B/1 (2.25 mm) or size needed to obtain gauge

Notions: Embroidery needle, scissors, sewing pins, removable stitch markers, sew on snaps size 4/0, sewing needle, sewing thread



GAUGE

28 sc x 36 rnds = 4"

Save time, check your gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

This pattern details how to make the Pants, Suspenders, Shirt, Bowtie, Shoes and Hair for the doll. Each piece of clothing is created to be removable and interchangeable with other dolls and clothing. The Hair is created and sewn on to the doll head permanently.

The Pants, Bowtie and Shoes will be worked in unjoined, continuous rounds. To track them, place a removable stitch marker in the first stitch to denote the beginning of each round. You will move the marker up each round after completing the first stitch of each new round.

This pattern uses a shorthand style of crochet instructions. Abbreviation descriptions and instructions are given in the Stitch Guide. Some examples are provided below:

- When working stitches around, instead of reading something like "sc in the next 2 sts," you will simply see "sc 2."
- When working repeats of sets of instructions in a round, instead of seeing something like "* sc in the next 2 sts, 2 scs in the next st; rep 4 mores times," you will simply see "(sc 2, INC) x 5."

STITCH GUIDE

Magic Circle (MC)

Make a circle with tail of yarn behind working yarn. Reach hk inside of circle made, yo with working yarn, pull up a lp, yo, ch 1, begin patt with indicated number of sts. Once Rnd 1 is est'd, pull tail of yarn taut.

Decrease 1 sc (DEC)

Sc2tog over the next 2 sts by inserting hk into indicated st, yo, pull up lp (2 lps on hk), insert hk into next st, yo pull up lp (3 lps on hk), yo draw through all 3 lps on hk.



Increase 1 sc (INC)

2 sc in the next indicated st.

Repeat Instructions (...)

A sequence of instructions to be repeated will be given inside parenthesis.

Repeat Counts (x)

An x followed by a number indicates the total number of times to repeat the sequence in parenthesis.

PATTERN BEGINS

PANTS

Make 2 Pant Legs alike.

Note: These Pants are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: Ch 23, sl st to 1st ch made, being careful not to twist, do not turn - 23 chs.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in 1st ch and place removable m, sc in each ch around - 23 sts.

Rnds 3-10: Sc in each st around.

Fasten off first Pants leg. Do not remove m.

Do not fasten off second Pants leg. Continue to Rnd 11.

Note: The first ch made will count as the first st of the Pants join and will be worked into twice. Once the first Pants leg is joined, you will work into one side of the ch while completing the first rnd. You will then work into the front side of the ch to begin the next rnd.

Rnd 11: Ch 1, place removable m in ch, sc in marked st of first Pants leg then remove m's from both Pants legs, sc 23, sc in the back of the ch, *one side of ch worked*, sc 23 around second Pants leg – 48 sts.

Rnds 12-19: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 20: Sc 11, DEC, (sc 10, DEC) x 2, sc 9, DEC – 4 sts dec'd, 44 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends. Roll up the bottom of the Pants legs to make a cuff.





POCKETS

Make 2 alike. Note: These Pockets are worked in turning rows from bottom to top. Row 1: Ch 7, turn – 7 chs. Row 2: Sc in 2nd ch from hk (*sk'd ch does not count as st here and throughout*), sc 5, ch 1, turn – 6 sts. Row 3: Sc 6, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Sc 4, *do not ch*, turn – 2 sts dec'd, 4 sts rem

Row 5: Sc 3, ch 1, turn – 1 st dec'd, 3 sts rem.

Row 6: Sc 3, *do not ch,* turn.

Row 7: Sc 2, ch 1 – 1 st dec'd, 2 sts rem.

Pocket 1, do not turn before continuing to Row 8. Pocket 2, turn before continuing to Row 8. Row 8: Sc in each st around the whole Pocket.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



Pin the right Pocket to the front of the Pants in an L shaped position with row 8 facing outward. It should be 2 rows down from the waist and 3 rows from the top of the cuff. The left Pocket will be 2 rows down from the waist, in a reversed L-shape. Once the Pockets are pinned equally and straight, sew on with the embroidery needle. Make sure not to sew the curved Pocket entry the hands would fit into.



SUSPENDERS

Make 2 alike. Note: The Suspenderes are worked in turning rows from bottom to top.



SUSPENDERS (continued)

Row 1: Ch 33, turn – 33 chs. **Row 2:** Sc in 2nd ch from hk (*sk'd ch does not count as st*), sc 31 – 32 sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Thread the leftover tails of the Suspenders through the top of the Pants above the Pocket. Whip stitch the tails around the waist and the suspender about 6 times to ensure a good hold. Finish off and weave the tails inside the Suspender. Once finished, whip stitch the second Suspender above the other Pocket. Do not attach the Suspenders to the back of the Pants. That step will come later in the pattern.



SHIRT

Note: This Shirt is worked in turning rows from top to bottom.

Row 1: Ch 28, turn - 28 chs

Row 2: Sc in 2nd ch from hk (*sk'd ch does not count as st here and throughout*), sc 2, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 3, ch 1, turn – 8 sts inc'd, 35 sts. **Row 3:** sc 35, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Sc 4, 3 sc in next st, sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 9, 3 sc in next st sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 4, ch 1, turn - 8 sts inc'd, 43 sts.

Row 5: Sc 43, Ch 1, turn.

Row 6: Sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 9, 3 sc in next st, sc 11, 3 sc in next st, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, ch 1, turn - 8 sts inc'd, 51 sts.

Row 7: Sc 51, ch 1, turn.

Row 8: Sc 9, Ch 8, sk 10 sts, sc 13, ch 8, sk 10 sts, sc 9 – 31 sc, 16 chs; 47 total sts.

Rows 9-15: Sc in each st and ch across, ch 1, turn - 47 sts.

Fasten off and weave in ends.





SLEEVES

Make 2 alike.

Note: These sleeves are worked in joined, turning rounds.

Attach yarn to the bottom corner of the open armhole of the Shirt.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in each of the armhole sts, sl sl to 1st sc made, ch 1, turn – 18 sts.

Rnds 2-5: Sc in each st around, sl sl to 1st sc made, ch 1, turn

Fasten off and weave in ends.

If there are any holes visible where the Sleeves meet the Shirt, use the embroidery needle and leftover yarn to sew it closed.

With a sewing needle and thread, sew the snap-on buttons to the opening of the Shirt to allow you to change the Shirt to another one if preferred.



BOWTIE

Note: This Bowtie is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds after Rnd 1. Rnd 1: Ch 12, sl st to 1st ch made, being careful not to twist, turn – 12 chs. Rnds 2-3: Sc in each st around – 12 sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for detailing and sewing.

Wrap the long tail around the center of the 3 rounds to create a bowtie. Tie the 2 tail ends in a knot and leave the long tail for sewing to the shirt.

SHOES

Make 2 alike. Note: These Shoes are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 9 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 9 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 9 – 9 sts inc'd, 18 sts.

Rnd 3: Sc 1, INC, sc 5, INC x 4, sc 5, INC, sc 1 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Rnd 4: Blo sc in each st around.

Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 6: Sc 8, (DEC, sc) x 2, DEC, sc 8 - 3 sts dec'd, 21 sts rem.

Rnd 7: Sc 8, DEC, sc, DEC, sc 8 – 2 sts dec'd, 19 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends.







ORANGE HAIR

Hair Base

Note: The Hair Base is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts.

Rnd 3: (Sc, INC) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts.

Rnd 4: (Sc, INC, sc) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Do not fasten off.

Hair Strands

Note: Each Hair Strand is worked back and forth over one row count, first chaining away from the circular Hair Base, then stitching back towards it.

Note 2: Before starting each new row, sl st to the next st of Rnd 4 of Hair Base. **Rows 1-12**: Ch 19, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 17 – 18 sts per Strand. 12 Strands total. **Rows 13-24:** Ch 11, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 9 – 10 sts per Strand. 12 Strands total. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



ATTACHING THE HAIR

Part 1: Start by matching up the MC of the Hair and the MC of the Head, then adding a pin to the top of the Hair to keep it in place.

Part 2: With the shortest Hair Strands centered on the face, pin the next longest Strands above each of the Ears. Pin the rest of the long Hair Strands side by side to the back of the Head to cover it. Adjust the Hair Strands as needed to fill any bare spots.





Part 3: To make the parted Hair in the front of the face, pin the first five shorter Hair Strands starting from the front of the left ear and working to the center of the face. Then do the same step for the right side of the face with those first five hair strands, this leaves two hair strands up and unpinned.

Part 4: Pin the last two hair strands on top of the other strands to the right giving a layered look to the hair.



Part 5: Sew the Hair Base to the Head using the embroidery needle and the long tail left over. Starting at the top of the head, make a few whip stitches around the outside of round 4 and through the hair and head to keep it from moving around. Your last whip stitch should be at the front of the part in the shorter hair strands.

Part 6: Sew the ends of Hair Strands down beginning at the shorter front Hair Strands and working your way around the head and ending back at the part in the hair. Fasten off and weave the end of the yarn in the hair and head to finish off.





FINISHING

Attach Bowtie

Use a sewing needle and thread to attach the Bowtie to the Shirt on the overlapping panel near the top corner.

Attach Suspenders

Cross the Suspenders on the doll's back and sew the ends to the top of the Pants waistband at an equal distance apart. The tension on the Suspenders should not be too tight.

Make Glasses

Center the 18-gauge wire on the eyeglass mold and shape the wire down and around the circles to create the two round spectacles. Finish off by pushing the end of the wire through the cutouts to make the stems. If the stems are too long, you can trim them with wire cutters to shorten them.

28 sc x 36 rnds = 4"

PATTERN NOTES

This pattern details how to make the Dress, Shoes, Hair Tie and Hair for the doll. Each piece of clothing is created to be removable and interchangeable with other dolls and clothing. The Hair is created and sewn on to the doll head permanently.

The Skirt portion of the Dress and the Shoes will be worked in unjoined, continuous rounds. To track them, place a removable stitch marker in the first stitch to denote the beginning of each round. You will move the marker up each round after completing the first stitch of each new round.

Decrease 1 sc (DEC)

Sc2tog over the next 2 sts by inserting hk into indicated st, yo, pull up lp (2 lps on hk), insert hk into next st, yo pull up lp (3 lps on hk), yo draw through all 3 lps on hk.

Increase 1 sc (INC)

2 sc in the next indicated st.

Repeat Instructions (...)

A sequence of instructions to be repeated will be given inside parenthesis.



Repeat Counts (x)

An x followed by a number indicates the total number of times to repeat the sequence in parenthesis.

Changing Colors

Work until 2 lps remain on hk, yo with new color and pull through the last 2 lps to complete the stitch.

PATTERN BEGINS DRESS BODY

Note: This Dress Body is worked in turning rows from bottom to top.

Begin with Dress color A.

Row 1: Ch 37, turn – 37 chs.

Rows 2: Sc in 2nd ch from hk (*sk'd ch does not count as st here and throughout*), Sc 35, ch 1, turn – 36 sts.

Rows 3-5: Sc 36, ch 1, turn.

Row 6: Sc 6, ch 9, sk 6, sc 12, ch 9, sk 6, sc 6, ch 1, turn – 24 sc, 18 chs; 42 total sts.

Row 7: Sc 16, DEC, sc 6, DEC, sc 16, ch 1, turn – 2 sts dec'd, 40 sts rem.

Row 8: Sc 16, DEC, sc 4, DEC, sc 16, ch 1, turn - 2 sts dec'd, 38 sts rem

Row 9: Sc 17, (DEC) x 2, sc 17 – 2 sts dec'c, 36 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



SKIRT

Note: This Dress Skirt is worked from the bottom of the Dress Body in unjoined, unturned rounds. Begin with Dress color B. Attach yarn to any bottom corner of the Dress Body and work along the bottom edge.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc 36, ch 2, sl st to 1st sc made, do not turn - 36 sc, 2 chs; 38 total sts.

Rnd 2: Sc 6, INC, sc 8, INC, sc 4, INC, sc 8, INC, sc 8– 4 sts inc'd, 42 sts.

Note: the INC's below are worked with dc sts instead of sc sts.

Rnd 3: (Dc, INC) x 21 - 21 sts inc'd, 63 sts.

Rnd 4: (Dc, INC, dc) x 21 – 21 sts inc'd, 84 sts.

Rnds 5-6: Dc in each st around.



SKIRT (continued)

Rnd 7 (Partial Rnd): Hdc, sc, sl st *changing to color B* – 3 sts to taper down the rnds.

Rnd 8: Ch 1 (does not count as a st), (3 hdc in next st, sl st in next st) x 42 - 126 hdc, 42 sl st; 42 total sets of ruffles made.

Then with a sewing needle and thread, sew the snap-on buttons to the opening of the top of the dress to allow you to change it if preferred.



SHOES

Make 2 alike.

Note: These Shoes are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 9 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 9 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 9 – 9 sts inc'd, 18 sts.

Rnd 3: Sc 1, INC, sc 5, INC x 4, sc 5, INC, sc 1 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Rnd 4: Blo sc in each st around.

Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 6: Sc 8, (DEC, SC) x 2, DEC, sc 8 - 3 sts dec'd, 21 sts rem.

Rnd 7: Sc 8, DEC, sc, DEC, sc 8 – 2 sts dec'd, 19 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends.





PINK HAIR

Hair Base

Note: The Hair Base is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts.

Rnd 3: (Sc, INC) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts.


Rnd 4: (Sc, INC, sc) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Do not fasten off.

Hair Strands

Note: Each Hair Strand is worked back and forth over one row count, first chaining away from the circular Hair Base, then stitching back towards it.

Note 2: Before starting each new row, sl st to the next st of Rnd 4 of Hair Base. **Rows 1-14:** Ch 26, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 24 – 25 sts per Strand. 14 Strands total. **Rows 15-24:** Ch 11, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 9 – 10 sts per Strand. 10 Strands total. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



HAIR TIE

Note: This Hair Tie is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds after Rnd 1. Rnd 1: Ch 12, sl st to 1st ch made, being careful not to twist, turn – 12 chs. Rnds 2-3: Sc in each st around – 12 sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for detailing and sewing.

Wrap the long tail around the center of the 3 rounds to create a bowtie. Tie the 2 tail ends in a knot and leave the long tail for wrapping around Head.





ATTACHING THE HAIR

Part 1: Start by matching up the MC of the Hair and the MC of the Head, then adding a pin to the top of the Hair to keep it in place.

Part 2: With the shortest Hair Strands centered on the face, pin the next longest Strands above each of the Ears. Pin the rest of the long Hair Strands side by side to the back of the Head to cover it. Adjust the Hair Strands as needed to fill any bare spots.



Part 3: Sew the Hair Base to the Head using the embroidery needle and the long tail left over. Starting at the top of the Head, make a few whip stitches around the outside of round 4 and through the Hair and Head to keep it from moving around. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Part 4: Flip the Head upside down and sew the Hair Strands down beginning at the pins along the back Hair strands and working your way around the back of the Head. Fasten off and weave in ends.



Part 5: Sew the short front Hair Strands down onto the forehead where they are pinned. Fasten off and weave in ends.





FINISHING

Wrap the Hair Tie around the head with the bow on the Head above the right eye. With the yarn behind each Ear, tie the two ends together under the Hair at the back of the neck. Trim any extra tails.

Row 6: Flo sc 6, ch 9 sk 6 sts, flo sc 12, ch 9, sk 6 sts, flo sc 6, ch 1, turn - 42 sts.

Rows 7-11: Sc 42, ch 1, turn.

Fasten off and weave in ends. Fold Rows 7-11 down so that the unused lp in Row 6 is showing. This will be the top of the Dress.



SKIRT

Note: This Dress Skirt is worked from the bottom of the Dress Body in unjoined, unturned rounds. Begin with Dress color C. Attach yarn to any bottom corner of the Dress Body and work along the bottom edge.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc 36, ch 2, sl st to 1st sc made, do not turn - 36 sc, 2 chs; 38 total sts.

Rnd 2: Sc 6, INC, sc 8, INC, sc 4, INC, sc 8, INC, sc 8, changing to color Dress color A on last st. Fasten off Dress color B - 4 sts inc'd, 42 sts.

Note: the INC's below are worked with dc sts instead of sc sts.

Rnd 3: (Dc, INC) x 21 - 21 sts inc'd, 63 sts.



SKIRT (continued)

Rnd 4: (Dc, INC, dc) x 21 – 21 sts inc'd, 84 sts. **Rnds 5-8:** Dc in each st around.

Rnd 9 (Partial Rnd): Hdc, sc, sl st - 3 sts to taper down the rnds.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

With a sewing needle and thread, sew the snap-on buttons to the opening of the Dress Body to allow you to change the Dress to another one if preferred.



SHOES

Make 2 alike.

Note: These Shoes are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 9 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 9 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 9 – 9 sts inc'd, 18 sts.

Rnd 3: Sc 1, INC, sc 5, INC x 4, sc 5, INC, sc 1 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Rnd 4: Blo sc in each st around.

Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 6: Sc 8, (DEC, SC) x 2, DEC, sc 8 - 3 sts dec'd, 21 sts rem.

Rnd 7: Sc 8, DEC, sc, DEC, sc 8 – 2 sts dec'd, 19 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends.





PURPLE HAIR

Hair Base

Note: The Hair Base is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds. Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts. Rnd 2: INC x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts. Rnd 3: Blo (sc, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts. Rnd 4: (Sc, INC, sc) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts. Rnd 5: (Sc 3, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 30 sts. Rnd 6: Blo (sc 2, INC, sc 2) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 36 sts. Rnd 7: (Sc 5, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 42 sts. Rnd 8: (Sc 3, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 48 sts. Rnd 9: Blo (sc 7, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 54 sts. Rnd 10-11: Sc in each st around. Rnd 12: Blo sc in each st around. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Hair Strands

Note: Each Hair Strand is worked back and forth over one row count, first chaining away from the circular Hair Base, then stitching back towards it.

Note 2: You will be attaching rounds to the front loops exposed from the blo only rnds of the Hair Base. Before starting each new row, sl st to the next exposed loop of the round you are working on.

Attach yarn to 1st front loop st of Rnd 3 of Hair Base.

Rows 1-6: Ch 15 turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 13 - 14 sts per Strand. 6 Strands total.

Do not fasten off. SI st to any front loop st of Rnd 6 Hair Base.

Rows 7-21: Ch 15 turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 13 - 14 sts per Strand. 15 Strands total.

Do not fasten off. SI st to any front loop st of Rnd 9 Hair Base.

Rows 22-45: Ch 15 turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 13 - 14 sts per Strand. 24 Strands total. Do not fasten off. SI st to any front loop st of Rnd 12 Hair Base.

Rows 46-72: Ch 15 turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 13 - 14 sts per Strand. 27 Strands total. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Note: Reference photos for Hair Base and Hair Strands are on the following page.





ATTACHING THE HAIR

Note: If the curls do not curl on their own, gently twist them to the right. Weave the end of the yarn in the Hair and Head to finish off.

Part 1: Start by matching up the MC of the Hair Base to the back side of Rnd 4 of the Head, then add a pin to the top of the Hair to keep it in place. Hair should be slightly angled back on the Head.



Part 2: Sew around the Hair Base using the embroidery needle and the long tail left over. Starting at the bottom rim of the Hair cap, whip stitch around the outside of the rim making sure to go through both the hair cap and the head to keep the hair from moving around. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Sc2tog over the next 2 sts by inserting hk into indicated st, yo, pull up lp (2 lps on hk), insert hk into next st, yo pull up lp (3 lps on hk), yo draw through all 3 lps on hk.

Increase 1 sc (INC)

2 sc in the next indicated st.



Repeat Instructions (...)

A sequence of instructions to be repeated will be given inside parenthesis.

Repeat Counts (x)

An x followed by a number indicates the total number of times to repeat the sequence in parenthesis.

PATTERN BEGINS

PANTS

Make 2 pant legs alike.

Note: These Pants are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: Ch 23, sl st to 1st ch made, being careful not to twist, do not turn - 23 chs.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in 1st ch and place removable m, sc in each ch around - 23 sts.

Rnds 3-10: Sc in each st around.

Fasten off first Pants leg. Do not remove m.

Do not fasten off second Pants leg. Continue to Rnd 11.

Note: The first ch made will count as the first st of the Pants join and will be worked into twice. Once the first Pants leg is joined, you will work into one side of the ch while completing the first rnd. You will then work into the front side of the ch to begin the next rnd.

Rnd 11: Ch 1, place removable m in ch, sc in marked st of first Pants leg then remove m's from both Pants legs, sc 23, sc in the back of the ch, *one side of ch worked*, sc 23 around second Pants leg – 48 sts.

Rnds 12-19: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 20: Sc 11, DEC, (sc 10, DEC) x 2, sc 9, DEC - 4 sts dec'd, 44 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends. Roll up the bottom of the Pants legs to make a cuff.



SHIRT

Note: This Shirt is worked in turning rows from top to bottom. **Row 1:** Ch 28, turn – 28 chs



SHIRT (continued)

Row 2: Sc in 2nd ch from hk (*sk'd ch does not count as st here and throughout*), sc 2, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 3, ch 1, turn – 8 sts inc'd, 35 sts. **Row 3:** sc 35, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Sc 4, 3 sc in next st, sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 9, 3 sc in next st sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 4, ch 1, turn - 8 sts inc'd, 43 sts.

Row 5: Sc 43, Ch 1, turn.

Row 6: Sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 9, 3 sc in next st, sc 11, 3 sc in next st, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, ch 1, turn - 8 sts inc'd, 51 sts.

Row 7: Sc 51, ch 1, turn.

Row 8: Sc 9, Ch 8, sk 10 sts, sc 13, ch 8, sk 10 sts, sc 9 – 31 sc, 16 chs; 47 total sts.

Rows 9-15: Sc in each st and ch across, ch 1, turn - 47 sts.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



LONG SLEEVES

Make 2 alike.

Note: These sleeves are worked in joined, turning rounds.

Attach yarn to the bottom corner of the open armhole of the Shirt.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in each of the armhole sts, sl sl to 1st sc made, ch 1, turn - 18 sts.

Rnds 2-10: Sc in each st around, sl sl to 1st sc made, ch 1, turn.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

If there are any holes visible where the Sleeves meet the Shirt, use the embroidery needle and leftover yarn to sew it closed.

With a sewing needle and thread, sew the snap-on buttons to the opening of the Shirt to allow you to change the Shirt to another one if preferred.





SHOES

Make 2 alike.
Note: These Shoes are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.
Rnd 1: MC with 9 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 9 sts.
Rnd 2: INC x 9 - 9 sts inc'd, 18 sts.
Rnd 3: Sc 1, INC, sc 5, INC x 4, sc 5, INC, sc 1 - 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.
Rnd 4: Blo sc in each st around.
Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.
Rnd 6: Sc 8, (DEC, SC) x 2, DEC, sc 8 - 3 sts dec'd, 21 sts rem.
Rnd 7: Sc 8, DEC, sc, DEC, sc 8 - 2 sts dec'd, 19 sts rem.
Fasten off and weave in ends.

SCARF

Note: This scarf is worked in turning rows. Row 1: Ch 81, turn – 81 chs. Row 2: Sc in 2nd ch from hk, sc 79, Ch 2, turn – 80 sts. Row 3: Tr 80, Ch 1, turn. Row 4: Sc 80. Fasten off and weave in ends.

BLUE HAIR

Hair Base

Note: The Hair Base is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts.

Rnd 3: (Sc, INC) x 6 - 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts.

Rnd 4: (Sc, INC, sc) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Do not fasten off.







Hair Strands

Note: Each Hair Strand is worked back and forth over one row count, first chaining away from the circular Hair Base, then stitching back towards it. Note 2: Before starting each new row, sl st to the next st of Rnd 4 of Hair Base. **Rows 1-8:** Ch 17, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 15 – 16 sts per Strand. 8 Strands total. **Rows 9-10:** Ch 15, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 13 – 14 sts per Strand. 2 Strands total. **Rows 11-12:** Ch 11, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 9 - 10 sts per Strand. 2 Strands total. **Rows 13-20:** Ch 9, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 7 - 8 sts per Strand. 8 Strands total. **Rows 21-22:** Ch 11, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 9 - 10 sts per Strand. 2 Strands total. **Rows 23-24:** Ch 15, turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 13 - 14 sts per Strand. 2 Strands total. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.



ATTACHING THE HAIR

Part 1: Start by matching up the MC of the Hair and the MC of the Head, then adding a pin to the top of the Hair to keep it in place.

Part 2: With the shortest Hair Strands centered on the face, pin the next longest strands above each of the ears. Pin the rest of the long Hair Strands side by side to the back of the Head to cover it. Adjust the Hair Strands as needed to fill any bare spots.



Part 3: Sew the Hair Base to the Head using the embroidery needle and the long tail left over. Starting at the top of the Head, make a few whip stitches around the outside of round 4 and through the Hair and Head to keep it from moving around. Fasten off and weave in ends.



Part 4: Sew the ends of the Hair Strands down, starting at the ones above either Ear and working around the back of the Head, ending at the strands above the next Ear. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Part 5: Sew the base of the shortest Hair Strands down to the forehead near the outside of round 4, leaving these last 8 Hair Strands standing up to give the look of upright bangs or fringe. If they do not curl on their own, gently twist them to the right. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Universal Yarn Bamboo Pop (50% bamboo, 50% cotton; 100g/292 yds)

Note: The Doll Body featured in this pattern uses Universal Yarn Bamboo Pop in the color 151 Hickory – 1 ball.

Shorts

• 115 Silken – 1 ball

Shirt (color A) and Shoes (color A)

• 101 White - 1 ball

Shirt (color B)

• 113 Sunny – 1 ball

Hair and Shoes (color B)

• 111 Sundae – 1 ball

Hook: US Size B/1 (2.25 mm) or size needed to obtain gauge

Notions: Embroidery needle, scissors, sewing pins, removable stitch markers, sew on snaps size 4/0, sewing needle, sewing thread

GAUGE

28 sc x 36 rnds = 4"

Save time, check your gauge.



PATTERN NOTES

This pattern details how to make the Dress, Shoes and Hair for the doll. Each piece of clothing is created to be removable and interchangeable with other dolls and clothing. The Hair is created and sewn on to the doll head permanently.

The Pants and Shoes will be worked in unjoined, continuous rounds. To track them, place a removable stitch marker in the first stitch to denote the beginning of each round. You will move the marker up each round after completing the first stitch of each new round.

This pattern uses a shorthand style of crochet instructions. Abbreviation descriptions and instructions are given in the Stitch Guide. Some examples are provided below:

- When working stitches around, instead of reading something like "sc in the next 2 sts," you will simply see "sc 2."
- When working repeats of sets of instructions in a round, instead of seeing something like "* sc in the next 2 sts, 2 scs in the next st; rep 4 more times," you will simply see "(sc 2, INC) x 5."

Photos are provided for your reference throughout the pattern. Please reference the Materials list to ensure you are using the correct colors per section, as some photos are duplicated and used across all doll accessory patterns.

STITCH GUIDE

Magic Circle (MC)

Make a circle with tail of yarn behind working yarn. Reach hk inside of circle made, yo with working yarn, pull up a lp, yo, ch 1, begin patt with indicated number of sts. Once Rnd 1 is est'd, pull tail of yarn taut.

Decrease 1 sc (DEC)

Sc2tog over the next 2 sts by inserting hk into indicated st, yo, pull up lp (2 lps on hk), insert hk into next st, yo pull up lp (3 lps on hk), yo draw through all 3 lps on hk.

Increase 1 sc (INC)

2 sc in the next indicated st.

Repeat Instructions (...)

A sequence of instructions to be repeated will be given inside parenthesis.



Repeat Counts (x)

An x followed by a number indicates the total number of times to repeat the sequence in parenthesis.

Changing Colors

Work until 2 lps remain on hk, yo with new color and pull through the last 2 lps to complete the stitch.

PATTERN BEGINS SHORTS

Make 2 shorts legs alike.

Note: These Shorts are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: Ch 23, sl st to 1st ch made, being careful not to twist, do not turn - 23 chs.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in 1st ch and place removable m, sc in each ch around - 23 sts.

Rnds 3-4: Sc in each st around.

Fasten off first Shorts leg. Do not remove m.

Do not fasten off second Shorts leg. Continue to Rnd 5.

Note: The first ch made will count as the first st of the Pants join and will be worked into twice. Once the first Pants leg is joined, you will work into one side of the ch while completing the first rnd. You will then work into the front side of the ch to begin the next rnd.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, place removable m in ch, sc in marked st of first Pants leg then remove m's from both Pants legs, sc 23, sc in the back of the ch, *one side of ch worked*, sc 23 around second Pants leg – 48 sts.

Rnds 6-13: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 4: Sc 11, DEC, (sc 10, DEC) x 2, sc 9, DEC - 4 sts dec'd, 44 sts rem.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



SHIRT

Note: This Shirt is worked in turning rows from top to bottom.

Row 1: Ch 28, turn – 28 chs

Row 2: Sc in 2nd ch from hk (*sk'd ch does not count as st here and throughout*), sc 2, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 3, ch 1, turn – 8 sts inc'd, 35 sts.



SHIRT (continued)

Row 3: sc 35, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Sc 4, 3 sc in next st, sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 9, 3 sc in next st sc 7, 3 sc in next st, sc 4, ch 1, turn - 8 sts inc'd, 43 sts.

Row 5: Sc 43, Ch 1, turn.

Row 6: Sc 5, 3 sc in next st, sc 9, 3 sc in next st, sc 11, 3 sc in next st, 3 sc in next st, sc 5, ch 1, turn - 8 sts inc'd, 51 sts.

Row 7: Sc 51, ch 1, turn.

Row 8: Sc 9, Ch 8, sk 10 sts, sc 13, ch, 8 sk 10 sts, sc 9 – 31 sc, 16 chs; 47 total sts.

Row 9: Sc in each st and ch across, ch 1 *changing to color B*, turn. - 47 sts.

Rows 10-11: Sc in each st and ch across, ch 1 changing to color A on the last ch, turn.

Rows 12-13: Sc in each st and ch across, ch 1 changing to color B on the last ch, turn.

Rows 14-15: Sc in each st and ch across, ch 1 *changing to color A on the last ch, fasten off color B,* turn.

Row 16: Sc in each st across.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

With a sewing needle and thread, sew the snap-on buttons to the opening of the Shirt to allow you to change the shirt to another one if preferred.



SHIRT POCKET
Note: This Pocket is worked in turning rows.
Row 1: Ch 5, turn [5]
Rows 2-4: Sc in 2nd ch from hk, sc 3, ch 1, turn - 4 sts.
Rows 3-4: Sc 4, ch 1, turn.
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.





Attach Pocket


Pin the pocket to the front, right portion of the Shirt just above the yellow stripe. Whip stitch the 3 sides of the Pocket to the shirt leaving the top open. When whip stitching, make sure to go through the edge of the Pocket and then through the Shirt.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



SHOES

Make 2 alike.
Note: These Shoes are worked from the bottom up in unjoined, unturned rounds.
Begin with color A.
Rnd 1: MC with 9 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 9 sts.
Rnd 2: INC x 9 - 9 sts inc'd, 18 sts.
Rnd 3: Sc 1, INC, sc 5, INC x 4, sc 5, INC, sc 1 - 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.
Rnd 4: Blo sc in each st around, *changing to color B on the last st*.
Rnd 5: Sc in each st around.
Rnd 6: Sc 8, (DEC, SC) x 2, DEC, sc 8 - 3 sts dec'd, 21 sts rem.
Rnd 7: Sc 8, DEC, sc, DEC, sc 8 - 2 sts dec'd, 19 sts rem.
Fasten off and weave in ends.





YELLOW HAIR

Hair Base

Note: The Hair Base is worked in unjoined, unturned rounds.

Rnd 1: MC with 6 sc, placing a m in the 1st st - 6 sts.

Rnd 2: INC x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 12 sts.

Rnd 3: Blo (sc, INC) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 18 sts.

Rnd 4: (Sc, INC, sc) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 24 sts.

Rnd 5: Blo (sc 3, INC) x 6 – 6 sts inc'd, 30 sts.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Hair Strands

Note: Each Hair Strand is worked back and forth over one row count, first chaining away from the circular Hair Base, then stitching back towards it.

Note 2: You will be attaching rounds to the front loops exposed from the blo only rnds of the Hair Base. Before starting each new row, sl st to the next exposed loop of the round you are working on.

Attach yarn to 1st front loop st of Rnd 3 of Hair Base.

Rows 1-12: Ch 9 turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 7 - 8 sts per Strand. 12 Strands total.

Do not fasten off. SI st to any front loop st of Rnd 5 Hair Base.

Rows 13-42: Ch 9 turn, sc in 2nd sc from hk, sc 7 - 8 sts per Strand. 30 Strands total.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.





ATTACHING THE HAIR

Note: If the curls do not curl on their own, gently twist them to the right. Weave the end of the yarn in the Hair and Head to finish off.

Part 1: Start by matching up the MC of the Hair and the MC of the Head, then adding a pin to the top of the Hair to keep it in place.



Part 2: Sew around the Hair Base using the embroidery needle and the long tail left over. Starting at the bottom rim of the Hair cap, whip stitches around the outside of the rim making sure to go through both the Hair cap and the Head to keep the Hair from moving around. Fasten off and weave in ends.
