FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width: 5½"

Length: 80"

MATERIALS

Universal Yarn *Uptown*
Worsted Spirit Stripes (100%
anti-pilling acrylic; 100g/180
yds)

- 504 Double Team – 2
balls

Hook: US Size I-9 (5.5 mm)
*or size needed to obtain
gauge*

Notions: Tapestry needle

GAUGE

14 hdc x 10 hdc rows = 4"

**Save time, check your
gauge.**

Knit, Relax, Smile, Repeat!

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PATTERN NOTES

Half-double stitches turn into an interesting Argyle pattern thanks to the special striping qualities of Uptown Worsted Spirit Stripes.

Gauge is crucial in this pattern. Be sure to check your gauge regularly and make any adjustments as the project progresses.

See photos at the end of the pattern to get an idea of how the Argyle patterning should progress.

SCARF

First Half

Ch 20, beginning in a blue portion of the yarn. Your last 3 chains should be white, right at the beginning of the color transition.

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook (first 2 chs count as hdc) and each ch across, ch 2, turn – 19 hdc.

Note: The piece should have both colors occurring within the first row. If not, rip and repeat the initial chain and Row 1.

Row 2: Hdc in each hdc across, ch 2, turn – 19 hdc.

Rows 3-6: Rep Row 2.

Check your work. If the design is not appearing within 6 rows, try starting from a different place in the ball.

Continue in pattern, repeating Row 2, until you are out of yarn. Fasten off last st leaving an 18" tail. Set aside.

Second Half

Work as for First Half.

FINISHING

Match up one end of the First Half with one end of the Second Half, matching the diamond pattern as much as possible. Seam ends together. Weave in remaining ends.



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
