

Pattern Collection: Accessories



Croc-a-Scarf

Designed by Universal Yarn Design Team

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Lower Width: 82"

Depth: 7"

MATERIALS

Universal Yarn *Classic Shades* (70% acrylic, 30% wool; 100g/197 yds)

• 733 Jubilant – 4 balls

Hook: US Size H-8 (5 mm) or size needed to

obtain gauge

Notions: Tapestry needle

GAUGE

1 Crocodile Stitch = 1" wide Save time, check your gauge.

PATTERN NOTES

This Scarf is worked lengthwise and is shaped like a crescent. It is shaped by reducing the number of crocodile stitches on each successive row.

SCARF

Chain 247.

Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook, ch 2 [sk next 2 chs, 2 dc in next ch, ch 2] across, ending sk next 2 chs, 2 dc in last ch, turn – 82 pairs of dc.

Row 2: Rotate work so the beginning ch edge is facing away from you and RS is facing. Ch 1, working around post of last dc from Row 1, work 5 dc around post, ch 1, work 5 dc around post of next dc (first crocodile stitch made), ch 1, [work 5 dc around post of next dc, ch 1, work 5 dc around post of next dc (crocodile stitch made), ch 1] across, ending crocodile stitch around last dc and beg ch 3, turn – 82 crocodile stitches made.

Row 3: SI st to second ch-2 sp from Row 1 (you should be between the second and third crocodile stitches from the end), ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same sp, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp from Row 1, ch 2] 77 more times, ending 2 dc in second ch-2 sp from the end, turn – 79 pairs of dc.

Row 4: Work crocodile stitches around each pair of dc as for Row 2 – 79 crocodile stitches made.

Row 5: SI st to second ch-2 sp from Row 3, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same sp, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp from Row 1, ch 2] 74 more times, ending 2 dc in second ch-2 sp from the end, turn – 76 pairs of dc.

Row 6: Work crocodile stitches around each pair of dc as for Row 2 – 76 crocodile stitches made. **Row 7:** SI st to second ch-2 sp from Row 5, ch 3

(counts as dc), dc in same sp, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp from Row 1, ch 2] 71 more times, ending 2 dc in second ch-2 sp from the end, turn – 73 pairs of dc.

Row 8: Work crocodile stitches around each pair of dc as for Row 2 - 73 crocodile stitches made.

Row 9: SI st to third ch-2 sp from Row 7, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same sp, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp from Row 1, ch 2] 71 more times, ending 2 dc in third ch-2 sp from the end, turn – 68 pairs of dc.

Row 10: Work crocodile stitches around each pair of dc as for Row 2 – 68 crocodile stitches made.

Row 11: SI st to fourth ch-2 sp from Row 9, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same sp, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp from Row 1, ch 2] 71 more times, ending 2 dc in fourth ch-2 sp from the end, turn – 61 pairs of dc.

Row 12: Work crocodile stitches around each pair of dc as for Row 2 - 61 crocodile stitches made.

Row 13: SI st to fifth ch-2 sp from Row 11, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same sp, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp from Row 1, ch 2] 71 more times, ending 2 dc in fourth ch-2 sp from the end, turn – 53 pairs of dc.

Row 14: Work crocodile stitches around each pair of dc as for Row 2 - 53 crocodile stitches made.

Row 15: SI st to sixth ch-2 sp from Row 13, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same sp, ch 2, [2 dc in next ch-2 sp from Row 1, ch 2] 71 more times, ending 2 dc in fourth ch-2 sp from the end, turn – 42 pairs of dc.

Row 16: Work crocodile stitches around each pair of dc as for Row 2 - 42 crocodile stitches made.

Row 17: Ch 1, work 1 sc in each ch-1 sp and 2 sc in each ch-2 sp across. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Block lightly.
