



## Pattern Collection: Accessories



### Hoarfrost Scarf

### DIFFICULTY

Basic

### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width: 5"

Height (excluding fringe): 57"

### MATERIALS

Rozetti Yarns *Cinema* (70% wool, 25% nylon, 5% cashmere; 100g/109 yds)

- 407 Deep Dive (A) – 1 skein
- 303 Happy Dolphin (B) – 1 skein

**Needle:** US Size 11 (8 mm) straight

**Notions:** Tapestry needle, crochet hook (for attaching fringe)

### GAUGE

16 sts x 14 rows = 4" in Stripe Sequence patt

**Save time, check your gauge.**

*Knit. Relax. Smile. Repeat!*

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## PATTERN NOTES

The first frost of the year begs for cozy scarves that are ready to be wrapped around your neck as you head out for the day. A rib pattern is among the comfiest of all for scarves, and using our Cinema yarn, even better. This single ply bulky yarn is perfect for cool weather projects like the Hoarfrost Scarf, which is sure to be loved by whomever you make it for.

This scarf is knit flat. Fringe is attached on each end during finishing.

## STITCH GUIDE

### Stripe Sequence

(even number of sts)

**Row 1 (RS):** With A, \* k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Row 2 (WS):** With A, \* K1, p1; rep from \* to end.

**Rows 3-4:** With B, \* k1, p1; rep from \* to end.

Rep Rows 1-4 for patt.

## SCARF

With A, cut 38, 16" strands. Set aside. *Note: This reserves enough of color A for fringe.*

With A, cast on 20 sts.

Work Rows 1-4 of Stripe Sequence, then work Rows 1-4 of patt, 44 more times, or until piece meas approx. 56" from cast-on edge, ending with Row 4 of patt. Cut B, cont with A only. Work Rows 1-2 of patt, 1 more time. Bind off all sts.

## FINISHING

Gently wash and block to finished measurements. Weave in ends.

### Fringe

Using 38 reserved 16" strands of A and holding 1 strand as 1 group, attach 19 groups evenly along each end of Scarf using crochet hook. Trim fringe to 7".
