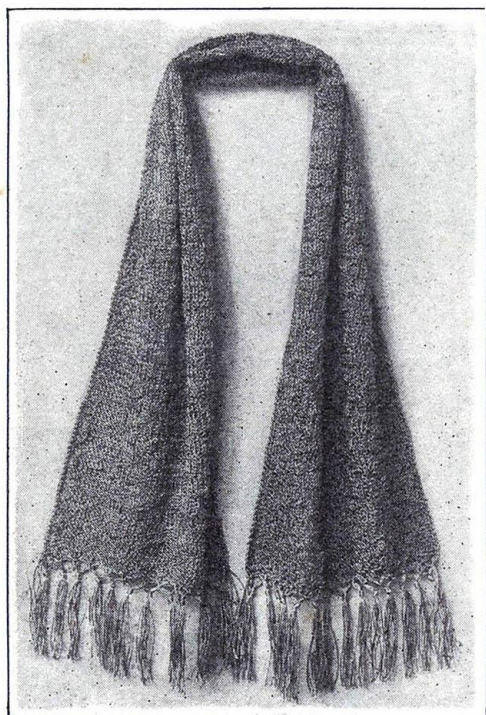

A Knitted Motor Scarf for the Man With an Automobile

Knitted Motor Scarf

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

6 ½" x 30" excluding fringe

MATERIALS

"Motor Silk in a medium shade of gray"

Substitute:

Wisdom Yarns Saki Bamboo (50% superwash wool, 25% nylon, 25% rayon from bamboo; 50g/230 yds)

- 211 Steel Gray – 3 balls

Needles: *"No. 12 steel knitting-needles, or for a tight knitter, a pair of fine bone knitting-needles."*

Substitute:

US Size 1 (2.25 mm) straight or size to produce the fabric you desire

Notions: Tapestry needle

GAUGE

34 sts = 4" in Garter Stitch

Save time, check your gauge.

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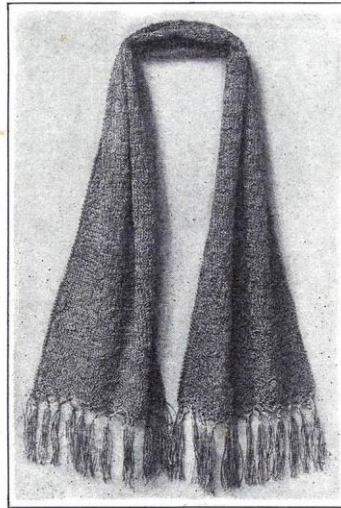
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CHRISTMAS GIFTS IN KNITTING AND CROCHET

A Knitted Motor Scarf for the Man With an Automobile

KNITTING and crochet may be used to develop many attractive gifts suitable for the various members of the family. For instance, a knitted motor scarf is a charming gift for a man. The model shown in our illustration is made of motor silk in a medium shade of gray, taking rather less than two spools. It is worked loosely with a pair of No. 12 steel knitting-needles, or for a tight knitter, a pair of fine bone knitting-needles.

KNITTED MOTOR SCARF—Begin with sixty stitches cast on and knit twenty rows in garter stitch. This is nothing but plain knitting worked back and forth and alike on both sides. After the twenty rows ten stitches at each end of the row are continued in garter stitch and the center forty stitches are worked in dice pattern, as follows:

First Row—Knit four, purl four and repeat to end. On the next three rows purl the purled stitches and knit the knit stitches, then knit plain for two rows.

Seventh Row—Purl four, knit four and repeat to end. On the next three rows purl the purled stitches, knit the knitted stitches. Again knit plain for two rows. This completes the second series of blocks.

Repeat from the first block pattern row until the scarf is thirty inches long, then knit twenty rows in garter stitch and bind off.

Work in single crochet on all the edges of the scarf to make them firm, then tie fringe in every fourth stitch across the ends. Each strand should contain six threads, each eight inches long, or four inches when doubled. When the strands have been knotted in, tie half of each strand to the adjoining half strand for the second series of knots.

SCARF

Cast on 60 sts.

Rows 1-20: Knit every row.

Row 21-24: K10, [k4, p4] to last 10 stitches, k10.

Row 25-26: Knit

Row 27-30: K10, [p4, k4] to last 10 stitches, k10.

Row 31-32: Knit

Repeat rows 21-32 until scarf is 30" long.

Knit 20 rows plain. Bind off. Weave in ends.

FINISHING

If desired, work single crochet along scarf edges to firm them up.

Make 180 pieces of 8" long fringe. Tie six pieces of fringe on every fourth stitch of the edge. Then knot half of each fringe section to half of the adjoining fringe section to create a decorative fringe effect.
